
Hello, everyone ...

- (1) Although it had Key West in its cross-hairs, the eye went over the area between Big Coppitt and Big Pine, putting us on the "good side" of the storm.
- (2) The predicted 5-to-10 foot storm surge did not materialize, assisted no doubt by the timing of a low tide.

We hope we don't ever see this again on the National Hurricane Center website! Yikes.
