SIX-MONTH ANNIVERSARY



Early July marked my six-month anniversary at St. John's as your Interim Pastor. As I reflected on this recently I thought more about the Town Hall Meeting we had in June. Besides touching on the themes of transitional pastoral leadership and a vision of possible new programs and ministries, I spent time asking questions about the history of St. John's, especially over the past 20-25 years. I sought answers regarding how you'd describe the DNA of St. John's; what you think makes SJUCC tick; what you celebrate about your recent history and what concerned you; and the process in which you engaged to become healthier.

I came out of that gathering feeling very good about where St. John's is at this moment of time in its 162 year history. By your responses it is evident to me that while you have encountered some "speed bumps" with regard to being the church, which created some growing edges, you came out of those times prepared to flourish and to effectively further the Kingdom of God!

I also got to pondering all of this in conjunction with the Search Team gathering to work toward creating a mission statement for St. John's. So it's been on my mind in particular ways.

My assessment of where SJUCC is now is that this is a healthy congregation with a lot to offer the community and a prospective pastoral candidate. Your administrative structure works well; your mission involvement effectively answers the question, "Who is my neighbor?" (and I must add that I continue to be impressed by the well-oiled machine that is The Shalom Food Pantry!); your musicality is to be celebrated; you have adapted well to the change in pastoral leadership; you've been open and welcoming to visitors and newcomers (five new members will be joining soon!); and you have exhibited genuine care and concern for one another in demonstrable acts of support and by lifting others up in prayer.

So....St. John's....I celebrate you! And I thank God for you and your ministries in this corner of the Henry County farmland and the surrounding community.

SIX-MONTH ANNIVERSARY



As I reflected on all of this, a little ditty was going through my mind. Sing these words to yourself, to the tune of the refrain of "Jesus Loves Me":

Yes, we are St. John's! Yes, we are St. John's! Yes, we are St. John's! The Lord has blessed us so!

What does it mean when we say "We are St. John's"? Who are we? As individuals we might identify ourselves by our gender, family relationships, ethnicity, or profession. As families or students we might identify ourselves by where we're from or for which school's teams we cheer. But as church members, who are we? How would you answer that knowing that we have over 350 active and inactive members and that this congregation is over 160 years old? I like the phrase in a UCC pamphlet that says "In essentials unity, in non-essentials diversity, in all things love." So love is a common thread.

But there's more. If we say or sing "Yes, we are St. John's," in addition to my assessment above, I believe we're saying, first and foremost, that we're Christian. And that says a lot! That has to be the "cornerstone conviction" of any faith family.

What are we? We're Christian – which means we're saved by grace through the sacrificial love of Christ. We're Christian – God's people, a holy family, belonging to the fold of the Good Shepherd. We're Christian – heirs to the faith of Abraham and Sarah, Moses, Ruth, David, Isaiah, John the Baptist, Mary and Martha, Peter, and Paul; a faith that continued to Luther, Zwingli, and to our forebears in this congregation and others. We're Christian – people of a promise that stretches forward because we have the faith that our future is in God's hands and the hope that heaven will be our final destination. We're Christian – and that makes a difference in the way we live, love, treat others, and spread the message.

Remember the old Budweiser commercial and the catchy jingle: "When you say Budweiser, you've said it all"? Well, I think a rewrite of that is needed. To me, when you say Christian, you've said it all!

"Yes, we are St. John's" – and we're Christian....and that speaks volumes. Let's keep on becoming more fully what we already are!

The Consistory thanks each and every one for your vote on the church heating project. If you were not in attendance or following by live stream, the hot water heating system was approved unanimously.

This is being written the week of July 10 and at this time I can tell you what I know on these projects.

Church heating system

In talking with Jeff Earl of Earl's Mechanical Services Inc., project components could be on site at the end of September. Installation would begin the first week of October and continue through to completion. Hopefully the supply chain is up to the challenge.

Funding at this time is under 5% of the total cost. If things go well and the projected is completed in October, I would anticipate receiving an invoice in the November/ December timeframe. At that time we will reach into the credit line bucket to offset any deficiencies in funds.

Office heating/cooling

Mike Kneuve will double check measurements on July 13 for the LG units and with everything being appropriate, installation will take place the week of July 17.

Funding for this project is complete. Thank you.

Hopefully it is already operational by the time you receive this newsletter.



Mission and Stewardship



CROSSROAD AUGUST MISSION

Crossroad Child and Family Services was founded as an orphanage in 1883, by the German Reformed Church in the United States, one of the predecessor denominations to the United Church of Christ (with whom we have a mission covenant). The majority of our founding churches are in the Heartland Conference UCC.

Since the 1950's, they have been working with children who are experiencing emotional/mental health challenges. Today they work with children ages 6 and up in residential services, community prevention services, outpatient services, and alternative education services. They have chosen to work with children in residential services who have very complex mental health diagnoses. Many are victims of sexual abuse, physical abuse, trafficking, neglect and/or other serious trauma.

They serve 500 or more children per year. In the past two years of the pandemic, their school became a New Tech Academy. They started training all staff on a new treatment model (from Cornell University), and they started Social Emotional Learning Day on Fridays.

You will want to hear the stories of why these have been important! Our church was a part of the founding of Crossroad in 1883, and you have helped literally 1,000's of children over the years!






