Welcome to Kinderprep's Summer Camp 2021. Looking forward to your child joining us this summer. Campers will experience the natural world in which people, animals and plants live on our beautiful Earth. Kinderprep summer camp is for preschoolers ages 2 ½ -6. Summer camp will run for 8 weeks. Camp will begin on July 6, 2021 and end on Aug. 27, 2021. Camp hours are 9a.m.-3p.m. however, your child is welcome to come as early as 7:00a.m. and stay as late as 6:00p.m.

Your son/daughter must be registered by January 4th to guarantee availability. After this deadline space is on first come basis until camp is full. Deposit is 50% of balance upon registration and remaining balances are due no later than June 1st to attend camp. All camp classes fill up quickly, so we suggest you register now. **Should you decide not to attend after registering all monies are non-refundable, NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE MADE.**

COVID-19 Health Pandemic Policies for Parents

Effective June 15, 2020

Screen Children Upon Arrival

Curb side drop off and Pick up only. Parents must wear masks when dropping and picking up. Please stay in your car until staff member is ready to conduct your child's drop off screening in the mornings or until they bring your child out to you in the afternoon/evening. Please call ahead and let us know when you are about 10 minutes away in the afternoon, so that a staff member can have your child packed up and ready to go.

Children and Staff who have a fever in excess 100.4 F, or exhibiting other symptoms of COVID-19, shall not be allowed to enter the facility, nor will persons that have exposure to persons known to have COVID-19 during the preceding 14 days.

- Children will be screened daily upon arrival to the center by a staff member outside the building. Information from these screenings will be reported to the DCF Office of Licensing daily.
- Students will arrive at their designated drop-off time.
- Parents will remain in their car until staff member approaches the car.
- Parent will be asked to take the child's temperature with a thermometer from home and show staff member the reading.
- Staff member must use the 6ft social distancing recommendations, while screening the child.
- Staff Member will ask the parent/guardian to check their child into [Brightwheel App](#) and answer the covid screening questions and record their temperature.
- Staff Member will also make a visual inspection of the child for signs of illness which could include flushed cheeks, rapid breathing or difficulty breathing (without recent physical activity), fatigue, or extreme fussiness.
- All Children and parents are required to wear masks during drop off and pick up.
- Staff member must wear a mask while conducting these screenings and while walking the children into the building. Before entering the building, the staff member will have the child use hand sanitizer on their hands and spray down lunch box and water bottle.
- Hand sanitizer must be kept out of children's reach and must be supervised.
- Staff member will sign in the child at drop off and sign out the child at pick up.
- Infants can be transported in their car seats into the building.
- Ideally, the same parent or designated person should drop off and pick up the child every day. If possible, older people such as grandparents or those with serious underlying medical conditions should not pick up children, because they are more at risk for [severe illness from COVID-19](#).
- Visitors shall not be permitted to enter the building during operating hours, with the exception of emergency or law enforcement personnel in their official capacity, Department of Children and Families personnel for child protection or child care licensing purposes, and

persons providing emergency repair services that cannot be delayed until center is closed. The above-mentioned visitors must wear face coverings. If they refuse, we will deny them to enter.

- Arrival times will be staggered

Social Distancing Strategies

- Classes will include the same group and 2 staff members each day. Each group will remain in their designated classroom area for the day. We have spent many hours reconfiguring our classroom spaces.
- Children will spend as much time possible outside. Please dress your child accordingly. Rain jackets are required for rainy days, rain boots optional
- Additional outdoor space has been created to allow for several groups to be outside at one time. We have added a tented area for outdoor classroom space, outdoor easels for both preschool and toddlers and coloring areas in the garden. Children will also continue to enjoy our music wall, giant chalk board, fairy gardens, play kitchen, gardens, sand pit, playhouse, outdoor climber, bicycles, hockey sticks and scooters. With a plethora of outdoor activities, we can adhere to the states 10 ft apart policy.
- All special days that involved large groups are cancelled until further notice.
- During nap time, we will ensure that children's mats (or cribs) are spaced out as much as possible, ideally 6 feet apart. Children will be placed head to toe to further reduce the potential for viral spread.
- Curb side drop off and pick up should limit direct contact between parents and staff members and adhere to social distancing recommendations
- Visitors will not be permitted until further notice. Only children and staff will be permitted into the building.
- Daily reports will be sent via Kid Reports
- New contact free payment options will be available
- All staff must wear a mask the entire time they are on the school's premises. **MASK MUST COVER MOUTH AND NOSE** Children in the preschool classes are asked to bring a mask to school daily. When feasible, children will be encouraged to wear a face mask/covering within the center.
- We will be [Brightwheel App](#) to send all daily reports as pictures.

Hygiene, Cleaning Disinfecting

- All children, staff, and volunteers will engage in hand hygiene at the following times:
 - Arrival to the facility and after breaks
 - Before and after preparing food or drinks
 - Before and after eating or handling food, or feeding children
 - Before and after administering medication or medical ointment
 - Before and after diapering
 - After using the toilet or helping a child use the bathroom
 - After encountering bodily fluid
 - After handling animals or cleaning up animal waste
 - After playing outdoors or in sand

- After handling garbage
- Children and Staff will be washing their hands a minimum of 14 times a day.
- All staff members will have a change of clothes to change into if there are secretions on it. All staff are to have their hair pulled back, fingernails kept short and shall wash their neck, hands and anywhere touched by a child's secretions.
- Staff will continue to teach and reinforce washing of hands, covering coughs and sneezes among the children.
- Each child's bedding will be stored in individually labeled bags in cubbies. A sheet and blanket must be purchased from Kinderprep for a \$10.00 fee. Sheet will remain at school. Cots and mats will be labeled for each child. Sheets will be cleaned weekly by the center. Nap Mats will be placed head to toe and spaced apart as far apart as possible.
- A schedule for cleaning and disinfecting will be posted. We will routinely clean, sanitize, and disinfect surfaces and objects that are frequently touched, especially toys and games. This includes cleaning objects/surfaces not ordinarily cleaned daily such as doorknobs, light switches, classroom sink handles, countertops, nap pads, toilets, desks, chairs, cubbies, and playground structures.
- Gloves will be used when serving or preparing food.
- All Infant Food, bottles, utensils must be brought home daily. We will no longer be making bottles. In case of an emergency we encourage you to leave back up formula or one bag of frozen breast milk.
- Windows will be left open as much as possible to allow for fresh air to circulate.
- Toys will be limited to individual groups and cleaned after each use.
- Each child will be given an individual art/school supply bag that will only be used by them. These bags will include pencils, crayons, markers, scissors, glue, paintbrush, playdough.
- The entire school will be deep cleaned weekly on the weekend.
- In addition to cleaning, sanitizing, and disinfecting the items mentioned above we will be fogging the school each night using Clean Republic sanitizer and disinfectant. This is natural product, made from Salt, Water, Electricity.

Clean Republic Disinfectant +Sanitizer is included on the list of products approved by the US EPA on the List-N. It meets AOAC efficiency testing for hospitals and meets OSHA Blood Borne Pathogen Guidelines and is approved by the EPA as a medical grade disinfectant. Response Procedures for COVID-19 Symptoms or Exposure

Any confirmed or suspected exposure to COVID-19 occurring in a childcare center must immediately be reported to both the local department of health and the DCF Office of Licensing.

Children or staff members who develop symptoms of COVID-19 while at the facility

- If a child or staff member develops symptoms of COVID-19 while at the facility (e.g. fever of 100.4 or higher, cough, shortness of breath), immediately separate the person from the well people. The child or staff member must then be picked up or leave immediately. If the child has symptoms

of COVID-19 (e.g. fever, cough, shortness of breath), the caregiver waiting with the child should remain as far away as safely possible from the child (preferably, 6 feet)

. • If symptoms persist or worsen, they should call a health care provider for further guidance. Advise the employee or child's parent or caregiver to inform the facility immediately if the person is diagnosed with COVID-19. A doctor's note will be required for all children who have been absent from school due to illness to return.

Children or staff members who test positive for COVID-19

• Centers that become aware of a COVID-19 positive case in their facility shall contact their local health department for guidance.

• Health officials will provide direction on whether a center should cease operations following the identification of a positive case in the facility. The duration may be dependent on staffing levels, outbreak levels in the community and severity of illness in the infected individual. Symptom free children and staff should not attend or work at another facility during the closure.

• All rooms and equipment used by the infected person, and persons potentially exposed to that person, will be cleaned, and disinfected in accordance with CDC guidance.

Returning to Child Care After COVID-19 Diagnosis or Exposure

If a staff member or child contracts or is exposed to COVID-19, they cannot be admitted to a center again until the criteria for lifting transmission-based precautions and home isolation have been met. Illness: We will continue to adhere to our sick policy in addition to the following:

- Parents it is imperative that you keep your child home when they are sick.
- Staff members must be vigilant for symptoms and staying in touch with facility management if or when they start to feel sick.
- Children or staff members who come to the center sick or become sick while at the center will be sent home immediately.
- Parents are to pick up their child immediately if the center calls informing the parent that their child is sick. Parents must have a back-up emergency person to get their child if they cannot get to the center within 30 minutes.
- Sick children and staff will be separated from well children and staff until they can be sent home.
- Sick Child will need a doctor's note to return to school.
- Sick staff members will need a doctor's note to return to work.
- Sick child will remain on a cot in the office until picked up
- If a sick child has been isolated in your facility, clean and disinfect surfaces in your isolation area after the sick child has gone home.

- If COVID-19 is confirmed in a child or staff member: The school will follow the CDC's recommendations for Environmental Cleaning and Disinfection. There is a possibility that the school would need to close temporary in this situation.

Travel Restrictions: Center will uphold any state travel advisories. Please be aware these may change daily depending on the increase of rates of COVID -19

Under the 14-day quarantine travel advisory announced by the Governors of New Jersey, New York and Connecticut, individuals traveling to or returning to New Jersey from states with increasing rates of COVID-19 are advised to self-quarantine for 14 days. This includes travel by train, bus, car, plane, and any other method of transportation.

The 14-day quarantine travel advisory applies to travel from certain states identified as those that have a positive COVID-19 test rate higher than 10 per 100,000 residents *or* have a 10% or higher positivity rate over a seven-day rolling average ("impacted states.")
