

Thoughts From Hatton

Instrumental Music

Given the principles of authority, how would the realm of instrumental music fall in line? First, one must consider the instances in which worship is concerned. One of these areas is at Ephesians 5:19. Paul is the one doing the writing. Within the context, the apostle addressed the Ephesians' worship. Paul wrote the following: "speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord" (Eph. 5:19). If a denominational believer is encountered, said believer may cite the Greek word for "making melody." The word in the original language for "making melody" is *psallo*, which means "to play a stringed instrument with the fingers" (Vine 402). Though this may be the meaning, the instrument being referenced is not mechanical. It is the voice. Lipscomb noted the following about the voice:

The human voice is the most complicated, delicate, and perfect musical instrument known to man. It is the perfection of the Maker's handiwork as a musical instrument, and is capable of more musical combinations and harmonies far sweeter and more varied than any and all instruments of human make, even than those 'invented by David.' All the varied sounds and all the multiplicity of intonations of the human voice are made by the tension and vibration of the vocal cords within the throat and mouth. The word *psallo* then would, and did from the beginning, embrace the music of the voice as well as that made by stringed instruments of man's invention (Lipscomb 107-108)



Psalm 119 is the longest Psalm in the book of Psalms. It is also the longest continuous section of scripture enumerated by 176 verses. This Psalm praises the wonderful word of God by using every letter of the Hebrew alphabet. Each section of this Psalm uses a different Hebrew letter to begin each line. In the first section, Aleph, each line begins with that letter. In the second section, Bet, each line begins with that letter, and so on until you get to the end of the alphabet.

There is no doubt, when one reads Psalm 119, about the extreme significance of regarding God's Word. Let us look at the many advantages of doing so.

- (1) We are blessed when we keep His testimonies and seek him with the whole heart (vs. 2). God has always expected the very best from His followers.
- (2) We will not be ashamed when we respect all of God's commandments (vs. 6). How many times have people hung their heads in shame by not obeying God's commandments? (3) We will be able to give an answer to those who may reproach us when the Word is implanted into our minds (vs. 42). We are to be ready to give an answer to those who would question us about our Christianity. (4) We will have liberty (spiritual freedom from sin) vs. 45. We will not have the guilt and shame of ungodly living weighing us down. (5) God will deal well with us when we stay in His Word (vs. 65). Jesus, Himself, said that those who hunger and thirst for righteousness will be blessed. Those who hunger and thirst for righteousness have a great desire to fill their minds with the Word. (6) We will be an encouragement to our fellow Christians when they observe our faithfulness (vs. 74). We need each other as we fight the battle with Satan. (7) Even when trouble and anguish come upon us, we can still delight in God's laws (vs. 143) because we know we have something better awaiting.
