It began to show me ever deeper aspects of Its splendor, and then one evening just directly Asked, Will you be able to withstand your own Magnificence?


I thought I was just hearing things, until A spring orchard I was passing my days with

Pastor's Study **Desk Notes**



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

26th Sunday Ordinary Time Year A

'Don't ask the scientist what he/she thinks about absolute truth, just observe how they work'. The catholic theologian Fr Bernard Lonergan wrote that line to emphasize the truth we demonstrate or verify through our actions. He wrote a lot in the field of modern philosophy, bridging the gap between reason and faith, science & religion. With that statement above, he was referring to the 'objective truth' revealed in what we do. Our actions and 'doing' reveal our convictions more often than our talk and words. A scientist may advocate 'skepticism' about objective truth or he/she may espouse 'relativism' when it comes to what we can definitively know. But, when we observe and watch their actual research work, we find that they have faith in the scientific method (replicable and self-correcting), and that their whole project of studious discovery testifies to the fact that there is something 'objectively' to be found in it. Without getting too deep into Fr Lonergan's thought, he is basically saying that our 'actions speak louder than words'! Or maybe we can say it this way, 'If you want to know what a person believes, watch how they act." The parable that Jesus teaches us in the gospel today, tells of two sons. One son says he will work but he doesn't follow through, and the other son says 'No way' but ends up going to work in the end. I think we all get it! Say what you will, I am watching for results! Jesus wants to see our faith in action, not just hearing us mouth our wishes to be His disciples! His call to action is "Follow me!" Like an old boss I had that always said, "Stop talking about it, and get to work!" The faithful son in Jesus' parable who actually followed the Father's command was the one who actually did the work, regardless of what he said earlier.

We call Jesus the "Word Made flesh' (John 1:14). I understand that to mean Jesus is the embodied Word of God, the enacted Word! The Word In DEED! All that Jesus taught, he fully demonstrated by His own life's work (Jesus' Sermon on the Mount was acted out in full display through every ministry encounter recorded in the gospels.) Like the first son in the Jesus' parable, there are a lot 'talkers' out there who have no intention of actually completing the job, (I hope you've never been put on a work crew with them!) and Jesus identified some of them in Matthew 23:3. He called out the Pharisees and Scribes as 'posers' and 'hypocrites', warning His apostles not to imitate them. Jesus said about them, "do and observe all the things whatsoever they tell you, but do not follow their example. For they preach but they do not practice." The Pharisees said the right thing, they just never did it! Following Christ is more than words. Jesus also taught in Luke's gospel that being faithful to Him involves more than just using His Name and talking about Him to others. In Luke 6:46-48, Jesus said, "Why do you call me, 'Lord, Lord,' but not do what I command? I will show you what someone is like who comes to me, listens to my words, and acts on them. That one is like a person building a house, who dug deeply and laid the foundation on rock; when the flood came, the river burst against that house but could not shake it because it had been well built." Of course, Jesus added in the next verse, that the 'hypocrite' who does not follow through on his word is "like a person who built a house on the ground without a foundation. When the river burst against it, it collapsed at once and was completely destroyed" (Lk 6:49).

So, our witness to Christ must be reflected in our way of life. We likely teach others who Jesus is, more successfully by our own lived example of His life. Maybe people who don't understand or accept Christ, they may be saying to us, "Don't just throw bible verses at me, Show me Jesus." They want to see action, a live-demonstration. I remember a prophetic woman at a Christian conference on stewardship one time sharing that publishing her checkbook ledger and appointment calendar, would be better proofs of her Christian witness (how she spent her time and money). That would demonstrate so much more convincingly her faithfulness, than anything she could say. Being humble (or not), she did not project any copies of the pages on the screen in her PowerPoint Presentation! But I take to heart, her insightful point that what we truly believe about Jesus, is proven in the records of how we spend our money and occupy our time! It is something to pray about and **do** something about! Peace and Prayers, Fr Brian
