# PROGRAM NOTES

Elegant Reflections provides a musical reflection of a very pleasant dream sequence that captures and paints a picture of a very good and positive day from your past, The lush harmonies and rich moving lines combine to create an almost cinematic retelling of the dream.

# PERFORMANCE NOTES

To capture the proper feeling of the work, it should be played with a sense of care and a lot of emotion. Work on phrasing throughout. While it is certainly performable by younger players that have not yet mastered vibrato, use of vibrato and good tone quality throughout will greatly enhance the performance. Strive throughout for good balance throughout and be sure that those sections carrying the melody come out strongly. 1st violins open with the melody. Five measures past letter A (measure 13) should suddenly be pllayed louder and become dramatically softer in the very next measure. The crescendos and decrescendos just ahead of letter B should be played with good balance. At letter B the cellos should be the loudest voice in the ensemble. All the other parts should provide balanced support. Contrast and dynamics become critically important in the fifth measure after letter D to achieve the most effective perofrmance. Finally, work to achieve good tone quality and balance between cellos and basses in the pizzicato section that begins in the fifth bar after letter E. Enjoy!

# ABOUT THE COMPOSER

M. L. Daniels was born in Cleburne, Texas. He received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Abilene Christian University after serving three years in a U.S. Air Force band, and completed his doctorate at the University of North Texas, where he studied composition with Samuel Adler. He served on the music faculty at Abilene Christian University for over 30 years, where he served as assistant band director and taught music theory, orchestration, counterpoint, analysis, and composition. There he also served as chairman of the music department for 15 years. Since he began his early retirement in, he has spent much of his time writing music and judging school bands and orchestras. He has won the National School Orchestra Association's composition contest five times, and has won the Texas Orchestra Directors Association contest one time, which is the maximum allowed. He has over 100 published compositions. In addition, he has works published for brass ensemble, solo wind instrument and piano, solo voice and piano, SATB, SSA, and TTB choir, full orchestra, string orchestra, band, hymns, and string quartet. Currently he has numerous compositions on the Texas UIL Prescribed Music List. He remains extremely active as a composer and as an adjudicator throughout the Southwest.
