In addition to preaching, he teaches classes and is involved in many works here at Willette. Our associate preachers *Mark West* and *Ben Smith* preach, teach classes, minister in the nursing home, coordinate our visitation teams, and work with our Bible camp and youth in general. In addition, we have a radio program on 102.1 FM that airs each weekday around 12:15.

We are a Bible centered, mission minded, and family oriented church. We hope you will enjoy our fellowship. Thank you for coming, and please return at every opportunity.

Starting the 28<sup>th</sup>, we will have just such a Meeting. However, the opportunity for service is now. Talk to others about the upcoming meeting, provide free advertisement by putting a flyer in your auto, and last but not least, *come*. If you can think of any other way to be of assistance, then feel free to ask my help or bring it to the attention of the elders.

Consider the fact that there may be friends of yours who go to their own church on Sunday and Wednesday nights. When we have a Gospel Meeting, it is *the* time that we have set aside for inviting those in the community and in our sister congregations to come be with us to better learn how to serve God. If by your influence just one visitor came through the door for the meeting, and if each member had just one other visitor that came because of their invitation, then we would have new faces all around us during the Meeting. This is a goal worth striving for.

One thing more, the meeting will be more successful if we recognize the need for a gospel meeting. This community as a whole is steeped in sort of an old-fashioned pentecostalism of the worst sort. This brand of religion denies sound reasoning (I Thessalonians 5:21), is hostile to Bible study (II Timothy 2:15), and in general promotes a zeal which is not according to God's plan for man's salvation (Romans 10:1-3). On top of it all, according to the statistics I have seen, there are many, many people unchurched (higher than compared with surrounding counties). With all of that going about, it is easy to see the great challenge that is set before us to get this area to turn to the Word. But it is more than just challenge, it is opportunity to grow in Christ and rejoice in the Lord. Come with an open heart and a Bible in hand to the Meeting, you'll be glad you did!
