

Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

Patris Corde 7. A Father in the Shadows

Being a father entails introducing children to life and reality. Not holding them back, being overprotective or possessive, but rather making them capable of deciding for themselves, enjoying freedom and exploring new possibilities. Perhaps for this reason, Joseph is traditionally called a "most chaste" father. That title is not simply a sign of affection, but the summation of an attitude that is the opposite of possessiveness. Only when love is chaste, it is truly love. God himself loved humanity with a chaste love; he left us free even to go astray and set ourselves against him.

The logic of love is always the logic of freedom and Joseph knew how to love with extraordinary freedom. He never made himself the center of things. He did not think of himself, but focused instead on the lives of Mary and Jesus. Joseph found happiness not in mere self-sacrifice but in self-gift. His patient silence was the prelude to concrete expressions of trust. St. Joseph, A Father in the Shadows, A Most Chaste Father, pray for us.
