21/22-34.      **Planning application PL/2021/03749 – 145 house development at  
Glenmore Farm**

Cllr Masson opened the meeting to members of the public. 1 member of public spoke  
Cllr Mason outlined various aspects of the application which is one of 3 areas in the  
outline development plan for Westbury which the Parish Council has already objected  
to. The development is not sustainable under CP1 of the Wiltshire Core Strategy or  
defined development under CP2

Wiltshire local plan has Empowering rural communities which shows no development  
just infills.

Heywood has a draft Neighbourhood Plan which had its first presentation in early  
2020 and is due to have its second in late 2021 and Glenmore Farm does not feature  
in it.

Heywood also had a Parish housing needs survey back in February 2019 by Wiltshire  
Council which showed no need for affordable housing, subsidised rental housing,  
sheltered housing or shared ownership.

Cllr Wickham then spoke and stated she had met with team leader and case officer  
in relation to the application. Although outside settlement boundary but it is adjacent.  
However Wiltshire does not have a 5 year land supply but the Neighbourhood Plan  
does carry a lot of weight.

She has called this in to the Planning Committee.

Discussion arose over access.

The Councillors then discussed the application and **it was agreed that the Council  
object and seek a 2 week extension.**

21/22-35      **Update on Hawkeridge Park playground**

The Clerk gave an update. He visited the area when idVerde were there on the 25<sup>th</sup>  
and were cleaning and cutting back foliage. Waiting for costs of repairs. It was too  
late to apply to the next Westbury Area Board Meeting. There are funds from the  
Parish Council to pay for the repairs.

21/22-36      **Update on Council's Annual Accounts and AGAR documentation**

The Clerk reported that he had taken everything to the Internal Auditor the previous Monday and had circulated information around the Councillors but will ask the External Auditor for an extension until after the next full Council Meeting on July 12<sup>th</sup>.

Cllr Wickham explained to write to the Secretary of State with objection over the Westbury Incinerator.
