Call to order	Meeting was called to order by Dr. Clark
SAM Thorasite	 Michael has offered the devices to paramedic services. So far, 59 devices have been delivered to 7 services Will continue to promote and offer
SAM Pelvic Splints	 Michael advised that we still have a small quantity of these available Will continue to promote and offer
Hypothermia project with PI committee	 Michael advised that the PI Committee was looking at secondary hypothermia as a possible PI project. They are gathering data to see if there is a significant problem Group discussed that in light of no reliably accurate methods to take a core temperature in the EMS setting, the project on our end might look more at educating on and having EMS document measures taken to prevent heat loss during transport Michael will coordinate with PI for next step
MCI/MPI Plan	 Michael noted that the State MCI template plan should be approved soon. Michael would like to see us expand efforts to get a regional plan in place. This would include more attention to multiple patient (5-8) plans since the MCI classes seem to overlook these. A regional plan would include agreement on SMART tags, SALT, use of ICS and good hospital communication It would also include the tracking forms we developed recently Would also include discussion about instances where there may be multiple small incidents in an area that may overwhelm a system or a hospital but not necessarily be one incident. (i.e. storm damage, ice/snow events)
Fall Conference	 MSTC has offered a proposal for hosting Committee has met once Will be Saturday, Sept 7 Save the Date info to go out soon
EMS-C Survey Participation Incentive	 Michael asked the group if we could develop a way to give EMS agencies in our region an incentive to participate in the survey. Provided we can get a report from EMS-C confirming which services participated, we will offer four (4) \$250 grants.

	 Awardees will be drawn from random from the list of all services that completed the survey. Services will be reimbursed for up to \$250 of pediatric-related products or training This will be in the 2024-2025 budget year All services will be encouraged to bring their survey results to a future meeting so we can discuss how the NCRTAC may help address gaps.
Active Shooter Incident Management Training	 Michael emailed all services in the region to gauge interest in bringing the C3 Pathways Active Shooter Incident Management training program to the region. It is an \$18,000 two-day course which will produce 10 instructors. Interest was minimal. Some areas are already doing their own system or bringing ASIM in through outside instructors Group agreed there was enough interest/commitment to move forward at this time.
