AMANA NEWS AND NOTES

Memorial Day Services Monday Some Numbers to Ponder

Monday, May 30 Memorial Day, special memorial services will be held at 9:30 a.m. in each one of the seven village cemeteries by the Amana Church Society. The same Bible text will be read at all services. All are welcome.

The graves of veterans in Amana Colonies will be decorated with a small American flag and with the United States Military Veteran service grave marker.

Cemeteries in the seven villages contain the gravesites of veterans of the Civil War, the Spanish – American War, the western battles with the Native peoples and all modern conflicts from World War I to the Korean and Vietnam conflicts.

This is a unique moment in American history America has experienced over 1 million Covid deaths. As of May 20, the CDC reports that there have been 998,512 total deaths due to Covid. However due to a one month lag in data reporting from some states, the New York Times and NPR Radio estimate that America passed the 1 millionth mark on May 17.

That is more Americans than died in all its 20th and 21st century wars and conflicts combined.

More Americans have died of Covid in the last two and one-half years than died in American's deadliest war – the Civil War - during which 635,000 American military died (both sides combined).

Since the pandemic started there have been 82,820,565 cases in America reported to the CDC (as of May 17). As of May 18, overall 77.7 percent of the total population of America has been vaccinated with at least 1 dose of the vaccine for Covid. 66.7 percent of the total population of America has been fully vaccinated.

In Iowa 9,572 people have died of Covid, according to the CDC, as reported in the New York Times as of May 20. There have been over 773,000 total cases reported in Iowa to the CDC. The 14 day average for average daily cases in Iowa has been ticking upward. In the past 14 days there has been a 33% increase in the number of cases confirmed.

In the state of Iowa only 62.1 percent of Iowans are fully vaccinated. That is below the national average by 4 points. According to State of Iowa's, Iowa Department of Public Health, website on Covid, 63 percent of Iowa County residents have been fully vaccinated. Johnson County has the highest percentage in the state with 73 percent fully vaccinated; Linn County has 67 percent and Benton has 57 percent fully vaccinated. Several counties are not reporting their data for vaccines and 15 counties in Iowa report having between 40 and 50 percent vaccinated. Davis County in southern Iowa cites having 37 percent fully vaccinated.

Iowa Ren-Faire is Back Memorial Day Weekend and June 4 – 5

It's here for two big weekends again this year. The Iowa Renaissance Festival will be in the Middle Amana Park, rain or shine, May 28 – 30 and June 4 – 5. The hours are 10 a.m. – 6 p.m.

The festival will be here this fall too coming back to the Middle Park on October 8 – 9 for an autumn rendition.

This is the festival's 30th anniversary! And yes they are planning plenty of fun including Joust Evolution, the Guardians of the Black Forest sword play, the rollicking drum band Pictus, the Fandazzi Fire Circus, the High Flying Fools and many more acts, plus living history encampments, games, fun, crafts, a merchant market and of course, food and drink. New this year is a Viking history and lore encampment.

AMANA SOCIETY HIGHLIGHTS

Welcome to the first installment of a column that we here at Amana Society hope will soon become a tradition. My name is Amy Svoboda Petta and I am an employee in Production at the Woolen Mill. There is so much going on at our businesses, and I want to let you in on news and happenings you might not otherwise hear about, and also to spotlight the hard-working folks of the Amana Society businesses.

First up, the only really reliable sign of spring we had this year considering these crazy temperature swings - calves.

I must admit I've been on the other side of the fence from every cow I've ever met so I spoke with Jen Sauers, Branded Beef Program Manager, who filled me in on the operation.

Calves began hitting the ground in February and during that time the three herdsmen (Fallon, Rodger, and Carter) were out checking cows every two hours - cold, snow, rain, wind, sleet, any kind of weather Mother Nature could throw at them 24 hours a day for six weeks. The minute a calf was born they were on the scene to make sure mother and baby were healthy, and to intervene if help was needed. Jen tells me that out of 300 heifers only three needed a hand calving.

After their "busy season" this crew builds and repairs fences, mows pastures, hauls water, and moves cattle. If you see them, let them know they're doing a great job; I know I will. Their dedication to the animals and hard work pay off every day.

In other news, if you would like to make a donation to help a young man from Ukraine who came here on a foreign student exchange program and is trying to return to his country and family at the end of the month, there is a donation box out at Warped and Woven. Our own Cindy Bowen (manager of Warped and Woven) is acquainted with Denny Rudin's Host Family through the Blairstown Lutheran Church, where Denny's Host Dad plays the organ.

You may have seen Denny wearing his traditional Ukrainian embroidered shirt on the Warped and Woven Maifest parade float. His family farms in the eastern part of the country, but has since moved to a safer location. As you can imagine, he is missing them every day. If you'd like to help Denny and his family, the box will be at Warped and Woven until the end of the month.

Well, that's it for this time. Please watch this space for more news and tidbits about what's happening at our Amana Society businesses.
