Michael Powers, Williams father survived the fire by jumping out the second floor window, he was taken to a Boston hospital due to injuries from the jump. Many members of the Houghs Neck Community made donations to the go-fund-me account and the victims fire fund set up at the North East Bank on Quincy Ave. Donations can still be sent to the bank. William was a student at St Coletta's School, donations can be sent there or to the HN Scholarship fund. It goes without saying we are all keeping the Powers family in our thoughts and prayers. Tuesday Feb. 21 the council along with Holy Trinity Parish and the American Red Cross held a blood drive. Register of Deeds & Assistant Recorder of the Land Court

It is Register O'Donnell's goal to provide a convenient way for residents to learn more about how the Registry serves them as it conducts business closer to their homes, saving them time and money.

Although, Registry staff cannot provide legal advice, they will be on hand along with the Register, to answer basic questions, transport documents for recording and assist in the filling out of a Declaration of Homestead form that provides for limited protection against the forced sale of an individual's primary residence to satisfy unsecured debt up to \$500,000. They will also assist a person in signing-up for the new Consumer Notification Program that alerts a homeowner when a transaction has been made against their property to alert them against potential cases of fraud.

Additionally, there will be on-site work stations that can provide real-time status of your mortgage discharge, print out a copy of your deed and provide a demonstration on how the Registry's On-Line Land Records Database works.

Open Meeting with Registrar William O'Donnell Tuesday, April 18, 2017

The office of Registry of Deeds will present a discussion on what a home, condo owner can and should do to protect their most valuable asset their home. included in the discusson will be Homesteading, Mortgage disposition and how to use the online information available to the residents of Norfolk County. The discussion will begin at 7PM on April 18th at the Community Center on Sea Street. All homeowners, Condo Owners and potential owners are urged to attend.

Red Cross Fire Safety Volunteers return to Ward One on Saturday, February 5

When people think of the Red Cross responding to disasters, they think of the large ones such as tornadoes and floods. Most people don't know that the vast majority of disasters the Red Cross responds to are fires in single and multi-family homes as well as apartment buildings. With this in mind, in 2014 the Red Cross started the Home Fire Campaign. This is a nationwide effort to teach fire safety and reduce the number of injuries and deaths. On all four Saturday's in February, the Red Cross of Massachusetts' Home Fire Campaign, with the support of Quincy Fire Department, will be in the City of Quincy. Volunteers will be working in Ward One on Saturday, February 25, 2017. Our goal each of these Saturdays is to install free smoke and carbon monoxide alarms in as many homes as possible. These alarms will be installed by trained volunteers and will comply with city and state code. Volunteers will also discuss fire safety with the residents. They have been out in the community networking with local organizations and leafleting door to door. Residents who would like to schedule an appointment or have questions can call: 1-800-746-3511.

QUINCY POLICE WILL BE PROVIDING FREE BASIC BOATING SAFETY COURSES

The Quincy Police Marine Unit, in partnership with the Massachusetts Environmental Police, will be presenting three Basic Boating Safety Courses at no cost to the public. These courses are designed for persons 12 years old and up, regardless of boating skill.

Courses are nationally approved, and course completion will allow persons to legally operate a boat in states requiring Basic Boating Safety Courses. Everyone who completes the course will be issued a Basic Boating Safety Certificate. All graduates in the 12 through 15 year-old age group will be legally allowed to operate a motorboat without adult supervision. The same is true for 16 and 17 year old youth who wish to operate a personal watercraft (jet ski, wave runner, etc.) In addition, some insurance companies offer policy discounts for customers that complete a Basic Boating Safety Course.

MARCH, (March 2, 9, 16) Course hours Thursday Evenings 6 PM till 10 PM

All of the above courses will be taught at the Hough's Neck Maritime Center, located at 137 Bay View Ave. (next to the Quincy Yacht Club on Sea Street).

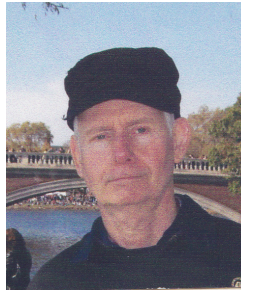

Dear Houghs Neck Residents:

The House of Representatives and the Senate have approved the joint rules governing the operations of the Joint Committees. All members of the House and Senate have received their committee assignments and the entire Quincy legislative delegation's committee assignments are serving at no less than a Vice Chair capacity on influential committees.

I have been promoted to the Vice Chair of the Joint Committee on Telecommunications, Utilities and Energy. I have served on this committee for three terms. The previous two sessions I was the Vice Chair of the Joint Committee on Community Development and Small Business. I am on three other committees, each of these for the first time. I am a member of the Joint Committee on Healthcare Financing which looks at the cost impacts on the healthcare industry and

patients. I am a member of the Joint Committee on Election Laws which deals with legislation pertaining to the operation of elections, voting rights, and campaign finance law. I am also a member of the Joint Committee on Marijuana which is a new committee that was created after the Marijuana ballot initiative was passed in November. This committee will create the legal framework overseeing the growth, distribution, and sale of Marijuana.

Representative Ronald Mariano will be serving his fourth term as the House Majority Leader and is a member of the House Committee on Rules. The Majority Leader is second to the Speaker of the House in the House leadership structure.

Representative Bruce Ayers is the Vice Chair of the Joint Committee on Tourism, Arts and Cultural Development. This committee reviews legislation pertaining to the

state's \$3 billion tourism industry. He is also on the Joint Committee on Export Development, the Joint Committee on Elder Affairs, and the Joint Committee on Public Safety and Homeland Security.

Representative Daniel Hunt is the Vice Chair of the Joint Committee on Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure. This committee oversees consumer related policy, the alcohol industry, the state lottery, and licensed professions such as electricians, plumbers, and cosmetologists. He is also on the Joint Committee on Judiciary, the Joint Committee on Revenue, and the House Committee on Ways and Means.

Senator John Keenan will be serving his second term as Chair of the Senate Committee on Bonding, Capital Expenditures and State Assets. This committee oversees the state's debt borrowing and approves all capital spending bills. In addition, Senator Keenan is serving as Vice Chair to two additional committees:

the Joint Committee on Mental Health and Substance Abuse, and the Senate Committee on Steering and Policy. He is also a member of the Joint Committee on Financial Service, Joint Committee on Labor and Workforce Development, Joint Committee on Transportation, Joint Committee on Judiciary, and the Senate Committee on Ways and Means.

With the changes in committee assignments, Representatives' offices may change. If any elected officials' room numbers or phone numbers change, you can receive the most up-to-date information at www.malegislature.gov. With the confirmation of committees, legislation is receiving bill numbers and being moved into committee. Public hearings will begin by late March and continue throughout the year. I am fortunate to work alongside a great group of colleagues and look forward to working with them on issues that impact Quincy and the Commonwealth.
