What is the CAP Solano Joint Powers Authority (JPA)?

Made up of each of the six (6) major cities in Solano County (Benicia, Fairfield, Rio Vista, Suisun, Vacaville and Vallejo), and Solano County.

- 1. Provides oversight/coordination of homeless services to the residents of Solano County;
- Serves as conduit for safety net funding;
- 3. **Administers funds** and makes grants available for homeless services;
- 4. Provides technical assistance and operational support to homeless shelters, and various other housing programs.

Coordinated Entry Accomplishments

- 1. Launched Resource Connect Solano in January 2018.
- 2. Served 927 individuals through the newly launched system.
- 3. Secured funding for a new Coordinated Entry system for survivors of domestic violence.
- 4. Added \$300,000 annually to the Coordinated Entry system for the next three years.

*A Continuum of Care (CoC) is a regional or local planning body that coordinates housing and services funding for homeless families and individuals.
