"Jesus said to the crowds: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." The Jews quarreled among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. "You'll never know if you don't ask!" The crowds are asking some good questions. Today they ask, "How can this man give us [his] flesh to eat?" (Jn 6:51) Last week they asked, "How can he say, 'I have come down from heaven'?" (Jn 6:42) The week before they had asked, "What can we do to accomplish the works of God?" (Jn 6:28) Good questions! So how about the answers?

Today Jesus teaches us that we are given a share in eternal life by our reception of Him. He is the 'living bread' come down from heaven (Jn 6:51). The Hebrew crowds would have understood Jesus' mention of 'special bread' from their history regarding manna bread God gave them in the desert with Moses. Jesus builds on that understanding to introduce this new 'heaven-sent' bread that not only nourishes for one day, but for eternity! (Recall that the Hebrews were to gather bread only for that day's eating and it would spoil by morning.—Yet Jesus gives a bread that lasts forever). Jesus is trying to help them understand this 'New Covenant Bread' that is actually Him. The bread that if Jesus, does not just show up impersonally dropped on onto the desert floor for them to pick up. No, Jesus' 'living bread' is personally handed from one believer to another, starting with His own life-giving hands (seen in his multiplying touch as He first grew enough bread and fish to feed over 5,000 from fives loaves and two fish). Jesus 'hands' this personal bread to us. That is the 'living' part (personal). The Bread that is Jesus is both 1) alive and growing itself and 2) gives life to others. We can ask ourselves, why the crowd quarrels over understanding this personal 'New Covenant' bread? *Was it* because their imagination was stuck in the past, and not able to let go of the idea of Moses' manna? Such 'new wine in new wineskins' (Mk 2:22) does require stretching one's previous understanding. Or was it due to a lack of faith in Jesus Himself, that they haven't seen enough of His wonderworking and been with Him long enough, to set aside their 'earthy' doubts. I hold that since 'Jesus says it, then I believe it!' **Or was it** fear of the consequences of receiving this Living Bread that is Him? This may be the toughest challenge to accept. We are to become, what we consume! If He is Bread and I unite with Him, then I am to become bread for others too -(Jesus tells us, "As I have done for you, you also are to do to others" In 13:15 --- If I feed you with my life, then give your life to others as food!) To follow, or imitate Jesus, would mean that I become like Him. So, following Jesus means that I also 'become food' for others. Or more simply, I feed others through the giving sacrifice of my service of them. My helping service should feed/build them up!

More questions will come from the crowd, but it helps us to hear some of their misgivings and doubts about Jesus and His teaching. We all at times, can revert back into past behaviors or just simply take our beliefs for granted. But Jesus poses some questions to the crowd (and us) too! Near the conclusion of this sacramental chapter of John's gospel, Jesus will ask, "Does this shock you?" (6:61) and "Do you also want to leave?" (6:67). We will address these questions in a week or so, but it reminds us that we always need to work on deepening our own trust and understanding of Jesus' words. If our Catholic teaching on Jesus' Real Presence challenges our minds, then that is good because it keeps us thinking and praying about what Jesus meant! Yet, even after we have perfect assent from our minds accepting the concept of His Eucharist Presence, we still have to work at reflecting our beliefs in our own real conduct. The Eucharist of Jesus re-forms us into His image – it feeds us for a selfless purpose and that purpose is to reflect Christ to others. (Do as He Does!) He institutes this when He says, "His Flesh is for the life of the world" (6:51) Jesus is Bread for others- Bread to feed and give life to others. I can say 'I believe' and my life not that belief. We call that bad witness. But it happens easily enough when our practices don't embody our principles. So, I ask myself, "Do I feed others by my life?" People talk about 'givers' and 'takers' in life. I remember my mom challenging us kids when we were acting selfish, and she would say, "You can't always be a 'taker' in life, you have to become a 'giver'. The Holy Eucharist creates such 'givers'. Jesus intends such 'life-giving' action from us, too, as a response to Him feeding us. So, we should turn and begin to feed others, just as He feeds us. Who knows, but it might be that such a challenging and 'giving' response that Jesus calls forth from us, might be what holds some people back from accepting His 'Real Presence' in the Eucharist? It is a challenge, but we are called to become what we receive! Peace and Prayers, Fr Brian
