

- Winfred forage brassica is a cross between a turnip and kale, generally termed a rape.
- Winfred is the most versatile of brassicas, being suitable for a wide range of soil fertility and environmental conditions, stock classes and sowing times.
- Early maturing at 10-12 weeks.
- Due to the potential of an earlier first grazing, Winfred has the ability to be grazed up to three times through summer and early fall, at which time it is regularly shut up for winter feed.

Winfred has good frost tolerance and retains leaf and stem quality in frosty or cold conditions. This feature may extend grazing times from early summer into early winter.

Once established, Winfred is tolerant of dry conditions. This product becomes a flexible multifaceted tool ideal for summer, fall and winter feeding.

Winfred is supported by an aggressive root system. This makes it an excellent covercrop option in soil improvement systems incorporating grazing.

Sowing Guide

- Suggested sowing time from Mar June and Aug Nov.
- Seed at 3-4 lbs/acre.
- Time to first grazing 8-10 weeks. May be grazed earlier in cooler summers and in winter in California.
- Sow with Crusader Italian ryegrass (10 lbs/acre) at 2 lbs/acre for extended summer/fall grazing under irrigation.
