*Did You Know...?* There is an automated external defibrillator (AED) at the LSC! This portable electronic device automatically diagnoses lifethreatening cardiac events and is able to treat them through defibrillation. With audio and visual commands, AEDs are designed to be simple to use for the layperson. The LSC AED is hanging in an alarmed box beside the elevator in the narthex. This box is not locked, but an alarm sounds when the door is opened to prevent tampering and notify those in the building that an emergency may be in process. Staff and LSC program leads have received a brief training on use of the AED.
