
Another year is almost over, and what a year we have had!

Camp Review

I was 1 of 50 people from around Victoria to attend the Theatrecraft Youth Unlimited Summer Performance Project. I was fortunate to receive a scholarship from MoArtz Inc. The Summer performance project ran over 9 days, from the 9th to the 17th of January. We participated in three workshops, developed scripting and rehearsals which lead to the performance of two productions being "1,2,3 Home" and "3,2,1 Leave(s)".

The first workshop was "Puppetry", which gave us an understanding on how puppets work and how to use them on stage. The second workshop was "Voice", in this workshop we learnt some fun and relaxing vocal warm-ups and exercises. The final workshop was "Acting" and this workshop taught us how to express ourselves and emotions on stage based on different scenarios.

I would recommend going to this program because...

- . You will meet a lot of new people and make good friends.
- . You will get the opportunity to perform on stage.
- . You will gain a lot more self-confidence when performing.
- . You will be able to help make a script from other people ideas.
- . You will be able to interact with the crowd, (making them laugh, cry, gasp, etc.)

I would like to thank MoArtz Inc. for this opportunity to attend, as without the scholarship I would not have been able to have such a good and fun experience.

On Saturday 2nd of April, Annette O'Shea, Mike Pullar and John Teague attended a Victorian Drama League workshop "Introduction to sound and sound effects" at the Peridot Theatre, Mount Waverley.

The facilitator, Lachlan Campbell took us through a whole spectrum of sound related topics, including control boards, speakers, microphones, cabling and software.

It was a fascinating and informative day with all participants learning a great deal on this complex area of theatre technology. We are sure the many tips & tricks learnt will help make Moartz future productions be "music to your ears".

The facilitator, John McKissock, demonstrated a broad range of lighting equipment, explaining the pros and cons of each. He then gave us a fascinating demonstration of the use of colour and shadow to enhance the mood of a scene and to boost or soften the visual impact of costumes, sets, props etc.

Open Studios Latrobe

Open Studios Latrobe in April 2016 was just as successful as our first in October 2015 but this time it was held over the whole weekend; Saturday the 16th and Sunday the 17th of April. Once again we were very lucky with the weather and our visitors came by the dozen!

We were partnered with Powerworks once again and our visitors found them very helpful in planning the visits and getting a taste of what the artists had to offer with a small exhibition on show.

We had new artists involved which was good for our visitors. Each studio averaged about thirty to forty visitors each day. Frayne's world, it's arty time

IN a retrofitted dairy shed in the hills of the Strzelecki Ranges, an Irish artisan is crafting bespoke silver jewellery.

Bathed in natural light from the wraparound windows that look out to the

large gum trees, John Frayne's studio is the perfect hide-away for any reclusive artist.

John said the property in Boolarra reminded him of his homeland after years on the road selling his wares to galleries across Australia and opening his own downtown studio in Fremantle.

"During that time I came through Gippsland and looked around and thought 'I'd love to live here' and it reminded me of Ireland, only five degrees warmer," John said.

"I felt like I should be moving here and that went on for about five years and I looked for a place and this place found me. I don't think I made a choice about it."

John is among 22 artists participating in Moartz's 'Open Studios Latrobe' event that invites locals to spend their weekend wandering through Gippsland art studios on Saturday and Sunday, 22 and 23 October from 10am to 4pm.

"I've always wanted to open my workshop to the public and this seemed like a good way to start," John said.

The craftsman said the studio, which sits beside his home, was the only building in a collection of sheds to survive the 2009 fires, a fate he attributed to its tin cladding.

Inside, John sits at a green vintage lounge chair by a wood stove as he manipulates and twists the silver and copper wires into submission.

He is surrounded by spools of the material hanging from recycled timber walls, a desk with soldering material, blow torch, a series of vices, an old library card filing system filled with trinkets and a bench of polishing wheels to give the silver its desired lustre. The former chemist and teacher has been making Celtic jewellery since the 1980s.

He said he was largely self-taught, first starting the practice to support himself through study and selling his work at market stalls on the streets of Dublin.

"People love the Celtic patterns. My work has always been well supported, everywhere that I've travelled, "John said. Many of the pieces are unique. Rings are made from decorative, souvenir spoons and forks have been used to make bangles and necklaces. He said a woman in Mirboo North recently brought him a fistful of heirloom forks and spoons and a week later asked if he could make something for her family. Using the decorative handles, he made four bangles for the family's four sisters.

"I cut them in the middle, soldered them together and made four bangles for (the) sisters, got them plated and gave them back to her," John said.

"It was something that had been in her family for a long time and now it's going back to her family again. There was something really special about that."

John runs jewellery making workshops from his studio and in Mirboo North.





A Place to Call Home

A PLACE TO CALL HOME - Now all we need is a name

As a vibrant growing theatre company Moartz was in desperate need to find more suitable and sizable storage accommodation than our current premises in Elizabeth Street Moe.

E-Street, as it was affectionately known, had served Moartz well for many years, however, the move to commence staging shows at the Monash Hall Yallourn North resulted in a significant increase in materials and equipment that required storage.


In order to transform Monash Hall into a temporary theatre Moartz invested heavily in the manufacture of tiered seating and partitions to significantly improve the ambience of the hall.

The tiered setting was a big hit with patrons but the 32 wooden block structures which formed the tiered setting where big and bulky and could not possibly be stored at E-Street.

The committee embarked on a project to find alternate dwellings and with the assistance of the Latrobe City Council we took a look at the old city depot in Mill Road Yallourn North. Upon inspection of the premises the Committee was unanimous in deciding that these premises would more than meet the longer term storage requirements of Moartz.

To seal the deal a three year lease was signed between Moartz and the Council and Moartz quickly restored power to the premises. Through the skill and direction of John Teague the premises is quickly being transformed into a workable space which Moartz can be proud to call home.
