Did you know that we had NOT ONE Sunday this summer that was under 200 in weekly worship attendance? Did you know that we are averaging JUST under 250 folks/week in worship for the year? Did you know that we are averaging JUST under 120 folks/week in Christian Education attendance? Did you know that we are now the third largest United Methodist congregation in our District? Did you know that our District Superintendent, Rev. Sylvester Weatherall, is very excited about what's happening at 301 N. College Ave., Aledo, IL? Did you know that he is NOT the only one?!

Great things are happening here. God is moving in ways that cannot be overlooked and cannot be denied. I have had the extreme pleasure of being involved in a decent amount of church growth. And it NEVER gets old! Why is that? Some might think it's about bragging rights- so that a pastor can boast to his clergy brothers and sisters around the ol' church water cooler. And while I can't speak for anyone else, for me that is simply not the case.

Both of my sons ran cross country. And one of the many things their involvement in that sport taught me was that they were never competing against anybody else. They were ALWAYS competing against themselves. There is a term in cross country- PR. It stands for "personal record". It is the BEST you have done at that particular thing. And at every race...EVERY race...the runners were trying to PR- break their personal record.

That's exactly what we're trying to do here. We are trying to PR- break our personal best. Why? Because we should ALWAYS strive to be the best we can be. We should always be pushing toward more fully becoming the people and the church that God is calling us to be. And as soon as we are satisfied with where we are and who we are...as SOON as...then God's blessing begins to diminish.

And that means that change is not only inevitable- it is to be expected and embraced. How do we measure the growth of a human being? Few churches get the opportunity that we are experiencing right now. There are a lot of churches out there who are dying...literally...for purpose. For forward momentum. And we have it. We are truly blessed by God. Therefore, I for one intend to buckle up, hang on tight and enjoy the wild ride that's ahead! Who's with me?

# **CURRENT AND NEW SERMON SERIES(S)!**

On Sunday, August 9th, we began two sermon series! Both wrap up on Sunday, September 6. At both 8AM and 10:15AM on Sundays, we finish <u>The Psizzlin' Psummer Psalm Psermon Pseries Psequel</u>. The last week of the series looks like this:

**Sunday, September 6-** <u>God is Good, All the Time</u> (Psalm 108) We are encouraged to sing praises to our God at all times and in all places. (Deuteronomy 10:20-21, Hebrews 13:15-16)

At The Point, the 6PM service, we have been walking through I Didn't Know THAT! The last week of this series looks like this:

**Sunday, September 6-** <u>The Disciples DIDN'T Know About the Virgin Birth!</u> (Matthew 16:13-16) Not ONCE do they mention it in the 3 years they spend with Him.

Then, on Sunday, September 13th, we begin not one but TWO NEW sermon series. At both 8AM and 10:15AM, we dive into <u>The Compass: A Vision Quest</u>. When business consultants try to help companies improve, many of them start with two simple questions: 1. What is the vision of your company? and 2. How well are you doing at accomplishing that vision? A company without a clear vision lacks purpose and direction. The same is true of churches. And yet, many churches don't have a clear vision for their ministry. Churches should be about worship, nurture, discipleship and outreach, but vision is what brings those things to life and puts them into action.

WE will spend 4 weeks talking about vision- what it is in general and what I feel God's vision for The Aledo United Methodist Church over the next 18 months is. WE will dig into the future of our church- what it looks like and what we need to do to be ready for God's call! The weeks of this series look like this: **Sunday, September 13- Worship** (Hebrews 10:23-25)

Worship is more than what we do on Sunday- it's a way of life. (Proverbs 29:18, Psalm 66:1-5)

Sunday, September 20- <u>Nurture</u> (Ephesians 4:30-32)

If you nurture the body, the spirit can expand. (2Peter 3:17-18, Habbakuk 2:2-3)

Sunday, September 27- Discipleship (Romans 12:2-3)

Discipleship isn't imitation but instruction. (Matthew 5:13-16, Joel 2:28-30a)

Sunday, October 4- Outreach (1Peter 2:9-12)

Outreach is reaching beyond our walls to connect people to Jesus. (Jeremiah 29:11-13, Matthew 28:16-20) Then, at 6PM, we will start <u>6 Steps to Grace</u>. Grace is, no pun intended, an amazing thing. But what IS it? Author Max Lucado says, "The meaning of life. The wasted years of life. The poor choices of life. God answers the mess of life with one word: 'grace.'" Grace is the free and unmerited favor of God, as shown through salvation and blessing. We will spend 6 weeks walking through what grace is and how you achieve it in your life. The weeks of this series look like this:

Sunday, September 13- Hearing (Matthew 7:24-29)

God's Word is more powerful than a double-edged sword.

Sunday, September 20- <u>Believing</u> (Romans 1:14-17)

Faith is the key that unlocks the door.

Sunday, September 27- <u>Repenting</u> (Luke 5:29-32)

We come to God to be cleansed of our sins.

Sunday, October 4- <u>Confessing</u> (Romans 10:4-11)

Thinking it isn't enough- we need to confess our faith in God.

Sunday, October 11- Baptizing (Romans 6:1-4)

When we are baptized, we become new creatures in Christ.

Sunday, October 18- Committing (Luke 10:1-9)

Stepping out in faith makes all the difference in the world.

Come each week expecting God to speak to you in powerful ways!

# SCHOOL BUS SAFETY

As a new school year begins, the U.S. Department of Transportation's National Highway Traffic Administration reminds parents, students and motorists to be alert and to put safety first in school zones and near school bus stops.

#### Teach children how to stay safe around a school bus:

Stand at least six feet (three giant steps) from the approaching school bus while waiting at the bus stop. Wait to board the bus until the driver says it is safe.

When getting off of the bus, cross the street in front of the bus and make sure the bus driver sees you.

Always watch for oncoming traffic when approaching or leaving the bus.

#### How motorists can keep kids safe around the school bus:

When driving in neighborhoods with bus stops, schools and school zones, watch out for children walking or bicycling to school.

Slow down. Look for children walking in the street, especially if there are no sidewalks in the neighborhood.


- Remember, children do not easily estimate vehicle speeds and often misjudge when it is safe to cross the street when a vehicle is approaching.
- Learn and obey the school bus laws. Obey the "flashing signal light system" that school bus drivers use to alert motorists of pending actions:

Yellow flashing lights indicate that the bus is preparing to stop to load and unload children. Motorists should slow down and prepare to stop their vehicles.

Red flashing lights and extended stop arms indicate that the bus has stopped, and that children are getting on or off. Motorists must stop their cars and wait until the red lights stop flashing, the extended stop sign is withdrawn, and the bus begins moving before they can start driving again.

### Labor Day

The first Labor Day was celebrated on Tuesday, September 5, 1882, in New York City. The first proposal of the holiday described it as a street parade to exhibit to the public "the strength and esprit de corps of the trade and labor organizations," followed by a festival for the workers and their families. In 1884 the first Monday in September was selected as the holiday. The idea spread with the growth of labor organizations and on June 28, 1894, Congress made it a federal holiday. It originated as a "day off for the working citizens" and now is celebrated by most Americans as the symbolic end of summer. In addition, Labor Day marks the beginning of the NFL and college football seasons. The NCAA usually plays their first games the week before Labor Day, with the NFL traditionally playing their first game the Thursday following Labor Day. Celebrate the working men and women of our country on Monday the 7th!

#### WHEN: Tuesdays at 2PM, starting September 8th


WHERE: Fellowship Cafe
