

# Eucharistic Ministry to The Homebound Guidelines and Protocols

I want to thank all of you who are a part of this important ministry. The inspiration of the ministry is to bring communion to the faithful who are ill and deprived of their rightful and accustomed place in the Eucharistic community. In bringing communion to them the Minister of Communion represents Christ and manifests faith and charity on behalf of the whole community toward those who cannot be present at the Eucharist. For the sick the reception of communion is not only a privilege but also a sign of support and concern shown by the Christian community for its members who are ill.

Remember, Holy Communion to the Sick has always been for those who cannot get to Mass for "health" reasons.

It is not our practice, nor are we permitted to provide communion to those who are not ill, but feel they are not ready to return to Mass for whatever other personal reason(s).

Outside of Mass, communion can only be provided for the homebound due to illness or injury, not for those who merely fear contracting an illness or do not feel up to attending Mass.

We need to be extremely careful not to enable people to stay home when they are capable of attending service. The emphasis and responsibility of this ministry is for those who are homebound for health reasons only and those who cannot find transportation to church.


