

The First Antiphon

Stichos 1: O God, my God, attend to me; why hast Thou forsaken me?

Refrain (after each Stichos): Through the prayers of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.

Stichos 2: Far from my salvation are the words of my transgression.

Stichos 3: My God, I will cry by day, and wilt Thou not hearken? and by night, and it shall not be unto folly for me.

Stichos 4: But as for Thee, Thou dwellest in the sanctuary, O Praise of Israel.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, both now and ever, and unto the ages of ages. Amen.

The Second Antiphon

Stichos 1: O God, why hast Thou cast us off unto the end?

Refrain (after each Stichos): O Son of God Who wast crucified in the flesh, save us who sing to Thee: Alleluia.

Stichos 2: Remember Thy congregation which Thou hast purchased from the beginning. Stichos 3: This is Mount Zion wherein Thou hast dwelt.

Stichos 4: But God is our king before the ages, He hath wrought salvation in the midst of the earth.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, both now and ever, and unto the ages of ages. Amen.

....O only-begotten Son and Word of God,

The Third Antiphon

Reader: *Stichos 1:* The Lord is king, let the peoples rage; He sitteth on the cherubim, let the earth be shaken.

Choir: (Troparion, Tone 1): O Lord, save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance. Grant Thou victory unto Orthodox Christians over their enemies, and by the power of Thy Cross do Thou preserve Thy commonwealth.

Stichos 2: The Lord is great in Zion, and He is high above all peoples.

Choir: Repeat Troparion

Stichos 3: Worship the Lord in His holy court.

Choir: Repeat Troparion

Instead of "O come let us worship..." the Reader signs the entry verse:

Exalt ye the Lord our God, and worship the footstool of His feet, for it is holy.

And immediately after that, the choir sings the Troparion of the feast:

Troparion Tone 1 (of the Feast)

O Lord, save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance. Grant Thou victory unto Orthodox Christians over their enemies, and by the power of Thy Cross do Thou preserve Thy habitation.

Kontakion — Tone 4 (of the Feast)

As You were voluntarily raised upon the cross for our sake, / grant mercy to those who are called by Your Name, O Christ God; / make all Orthodox Christians glad by Your power, / granting them victories over their adversaries, / by bestowing on them the Invincible trophy, Your weapon of Peace.

Instead of the Trisagion:

Before Thy Cross we bow down, O Master, and Thy holy Resurrection we glorify (3x)

Tone 7 Prokeimenon (of the Feast)

Reader: Exalt ye the Lord our God, and worship the footstool of His feet for it is holy.V. The Lord reigns, let the people tremble! (Ps. 98:1a)

The Reading is from the Letter of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Corinthians (for the Feast) 1 Cor. 1:18-24




For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. For it is written: Where is the wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the disputer of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of this world? For since, in the wisdom of God, the world through wisdom did not know God, it pleased God through the foolishness of the message preached to save those who

believe. For Jews request a sign, and Greeks seek after wisdom; but we preach Christ crucified, to the Jews a stumbling block and to the Greeks foolishness, but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God.

Alleluia and Verses Tone 7

V. Remember Your congregation, which You have gotten of old! (Ps. 73:2) V. God is our King before the ages; He has worked salvation in the midst of the earth!

The reading is from the Gospel according to St. John





Therefore, when the chief priests and officers saw Him, they cried out, saying, "Crucify Him, crucify Him!" Pilate said to them, "You take Him and crucify Him, for I find no fault in Him." The Jews answered him, "We have a law, and according to our law He ought to die, because He made Himself the Son of God." Therefore, when Pilate heard that saying, he was the more afraid, and went again into the Praetorium, and said to Jesus,

"Where are You from?" But Jesus gave him no answer. Then Pilate said to Him, "Are You not speaking to me? Do You not know that I have power to crucify You, and power to release You?" Jesus answered, "You could have no power at all against Me unless it had been given you from above. Therefore the one who delivered Me to you has the greater sin." When Pilate therefore heard that saying, he brought Jesus out and sat down in the judgment seat in a place that is called The Pavement, but in Hebrew, Gabbatha. Now it was the Preparation Day of the Passover, and about the sixth hour. And he said to the Jews, "Behold your King!" But they cried out, "Away with Him, away with Him! Crucify Him!" Pilate said to them, "Shall I crucify your King?" The chief priests answered, "We have no king but Caesar!" Then he delivered Him to them to be crucified. So they took

Jesus and led Him away. And He, bearing His cross, went out to a place called the Place of a Skull, which is called in Hebrew, Golgotha, where they crucified Him, and two others with Him, one on either side, and Jesus in the center. Now Pilate wrote a title and put it on the cross. And the writing was: JESUS OF NAZARETH, THE KING OF THE JEWS. Then many of the Jews read this title, for the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city; and it was written in Hebrew, Greek, and Latin. Now there stood by the cross of Jesus His mother, and His mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. When Jesus therefore saw His mother, and the disciple whom He loved standing by, He said to His mother, "Woman, behold your son!" Then He said to the disciple, "Behold your mother!" And from that hour that disciple took her to his own home. After this, Jesus, knowing that all things were now accomplished, that the Scripture might be fulfilled, said, "I thirst!" So when Jesus had received the sour wine, He said, "It is finished!" And bowing His head, He gave up His spirit. Therefore, because it was the Preparation Day, that the bodies should not remain on the cross on the Sabbath (for that Sabbath was a high day), the Jews asked Pilate that their legs might be broken, and that they might be taken away. Then the soldiers came and broke the legs of the first and of the other who was crucified with Him. But when they came to Jesus and saw that He was already dead, they did not break His legs. But one of the soldiers pierced His side with a spear, and immediately blood and water came out. And he who has seen has testified, and his testimony is true; and he knows that he is telling the truth, so that you may believe.

Instead of "It is truly meet..."

Refrain: Magnify, O my soul, the most precious Cross of the Lord. **Irmos:** O Theotokos, thou art a mystical Paradise, who untilled hast brought forth Christ. He hath planted upon the earth the life-giving Tree of the Cross: therefore at its exaltation on this day, we worship Him and thee do we magnify.

WHAT DOES THE CROSS SYMBOLIZE?



The cross, the principal symbol of the Christian religion, **recalling the Crucifixion of Jesus Christ and the redeeming benefits of his Passion and death**. The cross is thus a sign both of Christ himself and of the faith of Christians.

ELEVATION OF THE LIFE-GIVING CROSS

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit!

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ!

Today we celebrate Elevation of the Life Given Cross of Our lord and Savior Jesus Christ. The Cross, the symbol of our victory, a protection that is always available to us in the struggles for salvation of our souls. The Cross of our Lord on which He manifests His absolute love to humankind thru the suffering that He willingly accepted for the salvation of many.

For us Orthodox Christians it is not just some subject of veneration but rather Divine light that enlightens our souls and all our lives. From the very beginning of our earthly journey, as we were baptized

we receive a cross, as protection and symbol of belonging to People of God. In the course of our life, all our personal prayers and all sacraments that we receive in the Church, have that same symbol. After we will leave this militant church, the cross will be staying in our graves. Why is that? How come that this symbol is so important to us? Because this Divine light protects us during our life, and also after the death protected by the power of God. *"For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God."* (1Corinth.1:18)

The Holy Church established this day of celebration of the Holy and Life Given Cross in year 335, after construction of the Church of Resurrection in Jerusalem was complete and the cross of Savior was elevated inside of the church. But we commemorate on this day several events from history of the cross. The cross was elevated for the short period of time with the crucified Savior on it, changed the World and was buried, hidden from us.

St. Helen Equal to the Apostles and St. Makarious miraculously found the cross in the year 326, and so the cross was elevated to the people and Grace of God was reviled thru the miracles. The same cross was in Jerusalem and many people came to know a True God. We also commemorate the miraculous return of the Cross, after it was taken from us for fourteen years from the year 614 to 628. But by the Grace of God we would always get it back, so that we would continue to grow under the protection of it, and gather around it the flock of the Lord.

In our today's troparion we sing, " *save the Lord Thy people and bless Thy inheritance.*" What a blessing is given to us, what a privilege, are we really worthy to be called His people and inheritance? With that great power of the Cross, symbol of freedom and victory, we also



receive guidance and responsibility. We receive knowledge of how to deal with our own crosses and follow The Lord. "*If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow Me. For whoever desires to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake will save it.*" (Luke 9:23-24)

Be not afraid to lose your life for His sake. Let's rejoice and be thankful to the Lord, for what was once a weapon and symbol of the death, has become a weapon and symbol of salvation for us. Let's come and venerate The Holy Cross with fear and joy. With fear, because we do know how wicked is our nature. With joy because we know, and believe in the power that was given to us by the Cross of Salvation.

Uncovering of the Precious Cross by Empress Saint Helen in Jerusalem

The Holy Empress Helen uncovered the Precious Cross and Nails of the Lord at Jerusalem in 326. At the beginning of the reign of Saint Constantine the Great (306-337), the first Roman emperor to recognize Christianity, he and his pious mother Saint Helen decided to rebuild the city of Jerusalem. They also planned to build a church on the site of the Lord's suffering and Resurrection, in order to reconsecrate and purify the places connected with the Savior's death and Resurrection from the foul taint of paganism.

The empress Helen journeyed to Jerusalem with a large quantity of gold. Saint Constantine wrote a letter to Patriarch Macarius I (313-323), requesting him to assist her in every possible way with her task of the restoring the Christian holy places.

After her arrival in Jerusalem, the holy empress Helen began to destroy all the pagan temples and reconsecrate the places which had been defiled by the pagans.

In her quest for the Life-Creating Cross, she questioned several Christians and Jews, but for a long time her search remained unsuccessful. Finally, an elderly Hebrew named Jude told her that the Cross was buried beneath the temple of Venus. Saint Helen ordered that the pagan temple be demolished, and for the site to be excavated. Soon they found Golgotha and the Lord's Sepulchre. Not far from the spot were three crosses, a board with the inscription written by Pilate (John 19:19), and four nails which had pierced the Lord's Body.

Now the task was to determine on which of the three crosses the Savior had been crucified. Patriarch Macarius saw a dead person being carried to his grave, then he ordered that the dead man be placed upon each cross in turn. When the corpse was placed on the Cross of Christ, he was immediately restored to life. After seeing the raising of the dead man, everyone was convinced that the Life-Creating Cross had been found. With great joy the empress Helen and Patriarch Macarius lifted the Life-Creating Cross and displayed it to all the people standing about.


