5. Boldly share the gospel (*Acts 4:29*)
6. Forgive and love their persecutors (*Matt. 5:44*)
7. Be granted wisdom in covert ministry work (*Acts 9:23-25*)
8. Remain joyful amid suffering (*Acts 5:41*)
9. Mature in their faith (*Col. 1:28-29*)
10. Be rooted in God's Word (*2 Tim. 3:16-17*)
