Program Description

This workshop is designed to provide participants with an opportunity to explore an integrated framework for AAC and literacy assessment and intervention across the lifespan. The workshop will consist of four segments, dedicated to specific topics or areas related to AAC/AT and literacy. The first segment will include a review of advances in the field of technology used for communication and learning in order to create a context within which key terms, concepts, and principles associated with integrated literacy assessment and intervention can be discussed. Case illustrations of children, adolescents, and young adults with complex communication needs (CCN) will be used to highlight concepts and methods associated with integrated literacy assessment and intervention.

The second segment of the workshop will focus on the components of an evidence-based approach to literacy assessment and intervention. Resources, methods, and case illustrations of individuals with CCN using AAC to facilitate literacy-learning will be used to highlight interactive procedures, activities, and environmental supports for individuals with CCN.

In the third segment of the workshop, participants will review resources for literacy instruction across the lifespan, and will include case illustrations of literacy-learning projects and examples of inter-professional collaboration. A Vygotskyan framework for teaching and learning will be highlighted.

The fourth segment of the workshop will be dedicated to specific questions asked by audience members, a group activity in which participants will co-construct an integrated literacy-learning plan for a student with CCN, and/or additional case illustrations to highlight themes discussed throughout the day.

Learning Objectives

Participants will:

1. Identify advances in the field of technology used for communication and learning.

2. Describe key terms, concepts, and principles associated with integrated literacy assessment and intervention.

3. Summarize evidence-based practices in AAC and literacy assessment and intervention for students with CCN.

4. Identify resources for literacy instruction across the lifespan, AAC/AT literacy-learning projects, and inter-professional collaboration.

5. Complete a practice literacy-learning plan for a student with CCN.
