DEAD RECKONING ON [FINISHING]

Hey there.... hope everybody had a good holiday....

We played the quad city challenge in Columbus, just before thanksgiving.... there are 6 rounds for the guys and 9 rounds for the women... we started even and fell a little behind as the day progressed, but really fell apart the last round....

Not sure what happened for everybody else, but I struggled with doubles.... it looks like it's time to start playing more 27... always a good practice game....

I just read about a different solo practice game I'm calling "around the doubles". Basically, you shoot at "normal" doubles as well as all the other doubles while keeping track of how you do...

you start by making a list of all your "normal doubles" (here's mine) - D20, D16, D10 & D8, with the remainder (remember the bull) making up the rest of the list...now, print this list out and hang it beside the dart board...

You get up to 6 darts at each double....if you hit it within 6 darts, *circle* the number, pull your darts, and shoot at the next number....

If you do not hit the number within 6 darts, then draw a line thru the number and move on to the next one....

When you are all done, simply review the list & work on the numbers that you had trouble with.....

Keep tracking your progress and you will see improvement with practice!

Not rocket science, but a useful tool....

Triples for Show - Doubles for Dough! Being down first doesn't count if you miss the out!

World Champion Dennis Priestley offers this dart practice game. He uses various practice routines including this one called "One Dart Doubles." It's good practice for alone or with a friend for those crucial moments in a game.

Rules for One Dart Doubles.

Throw for double 1, double 2 & double 3 with the first three darts.

On your second turn, throw one at the double(s) you missed in the first turn, and then carry on for the next double in ascending order. i.e. If on the first turn if you hit D2 & D3, your second turn would be D1, D4, D5.

If you hit D1 & D5 your next turn would be D4, D6. D7 etc.

Carry on until all doubles have been hit up to the double bull.


When asked what he remembers the most from it all, the answer was quick, 'The people." he said, "I have met so many nice people through darts - that's what I remember the most."
