- I. Rise of the Song
 - 960 the Song reunited China
 - Emphasized Confucian ideals
 - Weak military paid tribute to Manchuria
 - Song promoted the scholar-gentry and civil service exams
 - Focused on tradition, social order, education, and the arts

II. Neo-Confucianism

- Revival of Confucianism
- Male dominated
- Scholar gentry less receptive to outside ideas and technologies
- Emphasis on tradition, social order and gender distinction

III Decline of the Song

- Weak military
- Paid tribute to numerous tribes
- Eventually conquered by the Mongols in 1279

IV. Women

- 1. Status was low and inferior
- 2. Tang and Song develop foot-binding
- 3. Done at age of 4-7
- 4. Began in10th century and abolished in 1949
- 5. Wanted to create a "lotus" or little foot 3-4 inches long
- 6. Women were usually unable to move quickly, sometimes not at all

VI Achievements of Tang and Song

- 1. Art, architecture, roads, bridges and canals built
- 2. Porcelain
- 3. Paper money
- 4. gunpowder
- 5. compass for navigation
- 6. abacus
- 7. movable type to print books
- 8. gov't focused of Confucian philosophy
