<p>Lock Box Project</p>	<p>Jill introduced the Lock Box Project as a community improvement endeavor, asking for input on any organizations that might welcome having them available; identifying any possible contacts, possible sponsor organizations, and representatives to make contact. Ruvine noted that magnetic locks for existing cupboards might be a good alternative.</p>

See details at http://wise-symposium.org/ • MCOs reported they are working on building capacity and providing training. They will be meeting with WISe providers on May 23rd. • Long waiting periods continue to be a challenge. The question of the necessity of all the restrictions was briefly discussed. • Carolyn Cox reported progress with coaching and training for youth peer counselors. • It was noted that families would appreciate more agency choices. • There was a suggestion to edit the video on the HCA website about WISe to be more in line with what actually happens and avoid creating unrealistic expectations.
