In May 2013, Sue Moran was diagnosed with a rare and aggressive form of gallbladder cancer. The cancer spread to Sue's stomach lining, bile ducts and lymph nodes. After 3 months of intense chemotherapy, Sue and her family learned that the treatments were not effective. The cancer is spreading and non-responsive to any traditional treatments. Sue needs urgent help to continue her fight for life.
