# Virtual Art Shows: One Engaging Solution to a Current Problem

For arts and cultural groups and programs, the restrictions prohibiting gatherings have resulted in canceled shows, indefinitely postponed events, and the question of how to actively engage the hearts, minds and spirits of the community from a distance. Groups have taken a close look at how to move forward with their missions during the time of COVID-19. Out of this chaos to move from in-person events and teaching to engaging from a distance, innovative collaborations have formed and virtual offerings are becoming more commonplace. Virtual arts shows are one example of how groups can work together to solve a problem while connecting to each other and the community.



The Broomfield Council on the Arts & Humanities (BCAH) collaborated with the Broomfield Art Guild (BAG) and Chamber Ensemble con Grazia (CEG) to create two virtual art shows, Friday Virtual Art Show I & II. The first show premiered on April 10 on Facebook and YouTube with over 1,000 views to date. Featured works of art were submitted by adult BAG artists and BCAH's Executive Director.

To include the work of artists outside of BAG and BCAH, a call for submissions was put out for the second show. New artists of all ages from Broomfield and outside of Colorado submitted impressive artwork, which led to a visually appealing virtual experience. The second show premiered on May 8 and links to the show was included in one of the City's daily health updates.

Throughout the videos, music can be heard in the background. Some pieces of the music were specifically recorded for the virtual shows and other pieces were past recordings of live performances. The music was supplied by Grace Asquith, director of CEG. Songs in the videos were played by an array of instruments, including the flute and piano.

Feedback from viewers about these shows included positive phrases like "a peaceful distraction," "enjoyed seeing the work of young artists," and "love the music with the art." Before the Friday Virtual Art Show III premieres in the upcoming weeks, the Virtual 39th Annual Student Art Show will premiere. In March, the 39th Annual Student Art Show was canceled one day before the event. Students who worked hard in their art classes to create their own masterpieces for the show missed their opportunity to experience being part of a gallery reception and art exhibit. Since this year's in-person art show will not be rescheduled, BCAH has offered art teachers the option of having their students' work show as a virtual gallery. Currently, Birch Elementary and Kohl Elementary have sent in their students' artwork.

## Data from the Dojo

After helping people create their LED holiday cards at BCAH's Holiday Photos with Santa event, The Gizmo Dojo revived the Paint-A-Pult and Touch-Free Piano and took them to Aspen Creek K-8's STEAM Expo and the Rocky Mountain STEAMFest. Everyone had lots of fun and we plan to bring an even bigger version of the Paint-A-Pult to Broomfield Days along with a much bigger target. What will that be? Come and see at the event!

Like many other groups, in March, we made the unhappy decision to cancel all open houses and in-person events until it's safe to gather again. We haven't been idle, though — several of our members put their 3D printers and sewing machines to work making face shields, masks, and other equipment for the Make4Covid project. The Dojo served as a local hub for makers in Broomfield and surrounding areas to leave finished pieces and pick up raw materials. By combining efforts, over 2,000 volunteers across the state managed to get more than 35,000 pieces of PPE to Colorado healthcare pros and other front-line workers in just over a month!

The program's 30+ members will continue to share stories in classrooms and senior care facilities in Broomfield and beyond, as soon as COVID-19 restrictions allow them to do so. Stories from select members are now available on two YouTube channels, the Spellbinders-Broomfield channel and the channel of Wynn Montgomery. Several members have also used group meeting technology to continue sharing stories with students. All are looking forward to being able to return to the classrooms for the 2020-21 school year. In anticipation of this return to normalcy, a training class for new volunteers is tentatively scheduled for August 6, 10, 13, and 17. All classes are held from 1-4 p.m. inside the Brunner Farmhouse. ## **Sustainable Broomfield**

Before the COVID-19 pandemic, the citizen group Sustainable Broomfield was really on a role. In 2019, we started with 5 members and a Facebook page. Soon, we had 180 people on our email list while holding monthly meetings with guest speakers, setting up booth displays at events like the Farmer's Market and Broomfield Days, building a website, and organizing a giant community Earth Day Festival.



At our January 2020 meeting, we summarized our group's objectives in vision and mission statements. Sustainable Broomfield's vision is to bring together residents, local governments, organizations, and businesses to transform Broomfield into a model for individual and community sustainability. Our mission is to accolarate the integration of

model for individual and community sustainability. Our mission is to accelerate the integration of environmentally sustainable lifestyles in our community. We will achieve this by providing residents with (1) Educational experiences, (2) Practical and convenient resources, and (3) Opportunities to advocate for sustainable public policy.

Then, as was the case with many organizations, things came to an abrupt halt in March. We postponed our Earth Day Festival and discontinued in-person meetings. However, our group has remained active online during the health crisis and community closures. On April 27, we hosted our first online Zoom meeting and had a number of new attendees! We enjoyed an informative presentation on the climate crisis and its solutions, as well as an optimistic view of a sustainable path for the future of Broomfield. Our guest speaker, Keith Meyer with the Northside Sustainability Alliance, shared some action ideas with which their group has had success. We are hoping to come up with our own action plan at our meeting on May 28, so that residents can participate and make a difference in our community. One idea is to start a compost pickup program for residents and from which community gardens can benefit.

For this summer, we have Monday meetings scheduled from 6:30-8 p.m. on June 22, July 27, and August 24 via Zoom. If circumstances allow, we will resume meeting inside the Brunner Farmhouse. There are no membership fees or applications and people of all ages are invited to participate. It will take everyone working together to make Broomfield a more sustainable place and we want to be the resource to make that possible. ## What's Growing Now

What's Growing Now

At the Broomfield Crescent Grange (BCG), "What's Growing Now?" seems to be the question these days. What does a community hub do, while our community and the world is going through a pandemic? What do we do when lifesaving medical protocols necessitate the cancellation of events, classes, sessions, group meetups?



As the light of the Spring warms the Earth, the longer days are filled with sunshine and moisture, nourishing the new crops. The Grange's garden begins to come alive with the new season. In our reflection of this new moment in time, we look toward ways that would cultivate partnerships and nurture the community.

What can we do in a more sustainable fashion? How can we help our community access healthier hyperlocal food? Can we help our local farmers and goods suppliers? Can we help our local economy? Can we support locally produced arts and music at the Grange? Can we do this in a way that respects medical protocols that observe social distancing?

Here are some of the things the Crescent Grange is doing right now:

We are researching several local CSA (Community Supported Agriculture) Farms. A new service in its infancy called "What's Growing Now," is similar to a food co-op. Locally produced foods from biodynamic spinach to organic ground flours are dropped off for participants each week at BCG. The foods will vary throughout the growing season. More information about this endeavor is available on our Facebook page listed under "Crescent Grange, Broomfield."

In our communal garden, we are preparing the soil to grow food for our members, families, and the local food pantry, Broomfield FISH. This soil has been pesticide-free and lovingly cultivated for years. Members show up with their gloves and masks and observe distancing. Even with the masks, we can still share stories and laughter. Working on the soil carries a sense positive connection, purpose, and healing.

For our monthly meetings, we are using video conferencing technology as seeing a screen full of familiar faces in real-time is a gentle comfort.

## **Calling All Music Teachers**

If you teach an instrument or voice, we are extending an invitation for you to join the Broomfield Music Teachers' Association (BMTA). Our purpose is to elevate the teaching standards of music in the community and promote cooperation among music teachers in Broomfield, Colorado, and the surrounding areas. We are affiliated with the Colorado State Music Teachers' Association (CSMTA), as well as the national organization, MTNA (Music Teachers' National Association).



Our meetings are designed to further the knowledge of the individual teacher, develop new skills in teaching, and encourage one another as professionals in our field. In addition, the organization offers yearly events in which teachers and/or students can participate, including Marvelous Musicales (4 shows per year), Piano Guild, Fall Festival, and the Piano Festival. ## **BackStory Theatre Pivots to Online and More News**

As have so many arts organizations, BackStory has been significantly impacted by COVID-19. We are so incredibly proud of our amazing, creative, talented staff who were able to quickly pivot in the middle of our winter performance academy season to online classes without missing a single rehearsal! With tenacity, humor, and a lot of patience, our students were able to complete modified performances for all classes and our amazing parent volunteer, Paul Romig-Leavitt, edited the Zoom recordings into minimovies for all the classes to watch together in online viewing parties.

Some classes, who were preparing licensed shows, converted their performances into devised theatre using the characters they'd developed to create songs, monologues, and scenes about the pandemic.

Students who were rehearsing custom scripts got crafty at home to create puppets and costumes to incorporate into their Zoom performances.

Here's how our summer looks with COVID-19 in the passenger seat:

While we were sad to see many of our outreach programs disappear for the season, we're having so much fun with free weekly online workshops for kids aged 0-18, including an amazing Spanish/English bilingual story playtime in collaboration with Broomfield FISH. We will continue to offer

many of these free online opportunities as long as COVID-19 keeps us all at a bit of

a distance.

Summer performances at the Broomfield Auditorium have been impacted, but the revised format is a great value with lowered registration fees and smaller class sizes. We decide week-by-week whether we're able to host the classes online or in our studio with safe distancing in place. Each class ends with a final showcase, which will be recorded for families. With the current uncertainty and so much time away from friends, many kids need opportunities for safe, welcoming, inclusive social interaction; support in building self-confidence; and additional literacy instruction to make up for lost time in school. BackStory's camps offer all of this, and more — plus, they're fun!

The Broomfield Council on the Arts & Humanities (BCAH) and its programs have been significantly impacted by the current circumstances associated with COVID-19. It's BCAH's mission to continue delivering creative content, while doing its part to safeguard the community. Several events have been canceled or postponed, such as *Luck of the Irish* fundraiser for BCAH and the Broomfield Crescent Grange, Broomfield Community Players' *New Play Festival* event, and ASTER Women's Chamber Choir's upcoming season, to name a few.

Whenever possible, BCAH programs and their talented and committed volunteers have found unique ways to share enriching opportunities and content with the local community.

Here are specific updates for BCAH staff-presented events and BCAH programs:

**ASTER Women's Chamber Choir** — The remainder of ASTER's 2019-2020 season has been canceled.

- **Broomfield Community Players (BCP)** BCP canceled its *New Play Festival* event and will provide updates in the next newsletter about their annual Fall show and holiday production.
- **Broomfield Days Poster Contest** While the BCAH staff is eager to see the amazing entries celebrating the spirit of Broomfield and Broomfield Days, we will continue to monitor the status of Broomfield Days 2020 before sending out a call for entries.
- **Broomfield Film Project (BFP)** BFP's annual short films event was in the stages of transitioning into mobile viewing events. BFP will now focus on assisting with the re-envisioning of BCAH's August Summer Sundays event as potentially a drive-in movie experience.
- **Summer Sundays** These family-friendly events for 2020 will be drive-thru's with art, music, free bags of prizes (June 14) and art supplies (July 12). Follow us on Facebook and check our website for locations.
- **Outreach events** Friday Virtual Art Shows will continue to be created as long as the creative community and residents express interest in these online videos.
