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HAZZAN'S NOTES



We have finally come to the beginning of our new religious year 5781. This year will be like no other in our modern history for these Yamim Noraim (High Holyday season). Synagogues, such as ours, will almost all be focused on producing online worship services for our congregations while buildings will be closed except to those creating, like ourselves, these service broadcasts. I want to thank our dear friend, Jim Sevin, who will be our Producer and tech for all our services from Selihot through Yom Kippur and beyond. Jim will be making sure

I wanted to alert you to some notes about this year's services.

First, because of COVID restrictions, the only people who will be allowed in the sanctuary (Meeting House) during our services will be Jim, myself, Mark Peterson, our Professional choir, our Shofar blowers for certain services, our Kol Nidre cellist, and possibly a board member for the Kol Nidre service. No one else will be admitted to the sanctuary complex. Please make sure that you can enjoy all our services in the comfort of your home on whatever device you have available.

Second, before Rosh Hashanah, all of you will have in your possession our High Holyday Mahzor for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. The Selihot booklet will be uploaded to our Facebook page as a virtual prayer booklet the week before Selihot for all to print out to follow the service.

Third, please note on our flyers enclosed in the Mishpacha the times of every service beginning with its organ prelude and then the service, in each case. These times will be strictly observed as to the commencement of each broadcast.

Fourth, because the First day of Rosh Hashanah falls on Shabbat this year, the shofar blowing is deferred until the Second Day of Rosh Hashanah. Thus, the Shofar will only be sounded on the Second day of Rosh Hashanah and the end of Yom Kippur this year. Thus, our Shofar blowers will only be in the sanctuary for those services.

Fifth, on a happy note, through a generous donation, our choir will be participating in BOTH the First AND Second days of Rosh Hashanah services this year to especially enhance Shabbat on the First Day and the Shofar experience on the Second day. We will have very special music, especially in the three Musaph sections of the service, namely, Malchuyot, Zichronot, and Shoferot.

And, finally, on Yom Kippur afternoon, you will want to tune into the service precisely on time with the organ prelude at 4:08 pm and the Minchah service beginning at 4:15 pm. Minchah will only last @ 20 minutes or so with its Torah reading, Book of Jonah Haftarah, and the highlighted liturgy sung with the choir and myself, and then we will directly proceed into the Yizkor/ Martyrology service which, upon its conclusion, will then proceed directly into the final Neilah service. There will be no specific time for each of these services individually. These services will all serve as one unit in the afternoon. So, please make sure you tune in on time, so as not to miss any of Yizkor/Martyrology or Neilah, besides our abbreviated Minchah service.

We hope you will enjoy these services this year even though we cannot all be together in person. Know that as a collective congregation, we are all together in spirit through these holyday broadcasts.

Yom Kippur: The Day of Atonement Purity

The Jewish national color according to the Tanach is white. When you observe our Hazzan (Canter) and his organist on the eve of Yom Kippur (Kol Nidrei) and during the Yom Kippur service you will see them clad in white, not only them, but our Holy Ark is covered with a white curtain along with a white cloth on the pulpit desk. The Torah scrolls, too have white mantles. The congregants are wearing white skullcaps. The significance of all the white on Yom Kippur is that white is the color of purity.

When we appear before G-D on Yom Kippur, the 10th day of Tishrei—September 28, 2020/5781 we are impure. We have sinned during the year and filled our record with bad deeds. Under these circumstances, the white is an expression of our desire for G-D to purify us by forgiving our wrongs. We sincerely do this by devoting ourselves to prayer during the entire day of Yom Kippur. Concisely, we show our sincerity when we ask for forgiveness. This is the answer and the great power of Yom Kippur. As many Rabbi's have told me, all of us who honestly repent on Yom Kippur and promise to improve are purified and forgiven. As my Bubba used to tell me in Yiddish, we become as white and clean as a new-born child. We begin our new year with a fresh start.

Now our white has another quality. White shows dirt very easily. So it is with us on Yom Kippur. We must remember to keep ourselves pure by living up to our prayers and promises.

Rabbi Block's grandfather, an old teacher of mine, would say, "we must seek only good and keep away from all evil. We must devote our lives to the study and practice of Torah."
