

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

6th Sunday Easter Year B

Jn 15:9-1'

Joy, Love and Fidelity! Three Amigos! That is Friendship! John has his favorite words! We hear three of them today. One of them is 'love' (John 15:9-10, 12-13, 17). Another one John uses today is 'joy' (2 times in verse 15:11), Yet, what about 'fidelity'? Well, John uses the word 'remain' or 'abide' (Greek 'meinate'). 'Abide' means to 'stay with', 'be beside' or 'always come to' – the same meaning we intend when we say that 'friends are always 'there' for us. Think of a loyal-faithful-constant companion. That is fidelity. Friends share in all things with one another, going through everything together. Chinese philosopher Mencius describes friendship as "one mind in two bodies". Roman Philosopher Statesman Cicero said that a 'friend is a second self, doubling your happiness and halving your sorrow'. So, when times are good you are blessed to share and enjoy them with someone. Yet, even when times are bad, you are still blessed, having a deep 'joy' inside, because of who you are with, going through the trial together. That is 'fidelity'.

And that is exactly what Jesus is describing about our relationship to Him, when He tells us in John 15:15 "I have called you friends". He <u>remains</u> with us (fidelity). In fact, He moves into us when we openly accept Him – in John 14:23, Jesus says, "We will come to that person and make our dwelling with him.) So, what a gift that Jesus calls us, friends! And what a 'faithful' friend Jesus is! He keeps faith with us, even when we may break faith (our sin). A great example of this, is when we hear that Jesus loved His friends 'to the end' (even as He was being crucified -due to our sins- and through the apostles--representing us--abandoning Him). John 13:1 says, "Jesus loved his own in the world and he loved them to the end."

What a marvel that we can be friends with God in Jesus. We could never have initiated such a friendship. Friendship with God is His initiative (*He had to invite us into such a life together*), which is why Jesus mentions, "It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you" (John 15:16). Also, 1 John 4:10 tells us that God made the first move toward us, to be friend us by reminding us that it is "not that we have loved God, but that he first loved us."

Prior to Jesus drawing us into friendship with God (all of us who accept, believe and trust in Him), I can think of only two Old Testament figures who were described as being friends with God. One of them, Moses, scripture itself comes right out and states that, "The LORD used to speak to Moses face to face, as *a person speaks to a friend*" (Exodus 33:11). The other 'friend of God' is King David, who is described by God Himself, as being 'chosen' to lead, 'because David is 'a man after my own heart'. That is a close relationship described by God. We see repeated examples of God's ever-faithful friendship as God bears with David, and Loves him through even all of David's failures to keep faith. Again, just as we see later in Jesus' own life, God sets the standard for friendship, and what actions and attitude constitute friendship: Love, Joy and Fidelity! All three are found in today's gospel, where Jesus summarizes it as "There's no greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends" (John 15:13).

I've aways been drawn to a definition of friendship inspired by some comments by the fox character in Antoine de Saint-Exupery's book 'The Little Prince'. The fox mentions that 'if you are to come to me at four o'clock in the afternoon, then at three o'clock I shall begin to feel happy, and as the hour advances I shall get happier and happier.....'(*Page 84 HBJ edition*). The fox is emphasizing the elements of joy and fidelity in friendship - the fact that we are made better by a friend's presence/influence and a friend creates that gentle stirring in our soul when we think of them. Yet, for Christians, perhaps the classic work written on friendship based on Jesus, is from the most prominent of the Cistercian abbots of 12th-century England, Aelred of Rievaulx (b. 1110–d. 1167). He wrote "Spiritual Friendship" when asked by his monks that he served and led in his monastery what it meant to be a 'friend in Christ'. Aelred taught that what makes a friendship 'spiritual' is that it begins in God, continues in God, and is perfected in God. Just as Jesus initiated friendship with us, faithfully walking with us and calling us to join Him living beyond anything this world offers, Him forever, there is no kinship any more spiritual than that to be found!
