Hello Everyone!

'm excited that we are in the midst of 40 days of prayer as a church. For me, this has been a wonderful exercise in stretching out my "prayer muscles" and growing in strength as I challenge myself to pray with someone every day. It's great to know that others in our church are taking this time to pray daily, in new ways and frequencies.

Prayer is often difficult at times. We know that we should bring everything to God in prayer, but that's something that seems easier said than done. We are good at bringing God our requests for healing, overcoming tests and challenges, and guidance with issues, but is that all prayer is? I think God wants more of us than that!

When I was in college, I took a class taught by a former lawyer. Someone asked her why she stopped being a lawyer and became a professor, and this was her answer, "as a lawyer, I got tired of people only coming to me with their problems." I never forgot that perspective: we only go to a lawyer with problems, never things about which to celebrate and get excited. Do we sometimes do that with God, only come to him with difficulties and bad news?

Like any loved one, family member, or friend, God wants to hear everything about us! When you have good news, who are those you immediately call? When something excites you, with whom do you share it? God wants us to run to him and share all those exciting stories and any good news with him! How would that change our prayer life when we think to turn to God in prayer when we have good news to share and exciting things to talk about?

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 says, "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." Praying without ceasing seems like a daunting challenge, but when you think of it as more of a conversation, it makes more sense. Think of it as the command to "always be talking to your best friends and family."

Who are those you talk to the most? What starts those conversations, how do they flow, and what kind of joy do you get out of them? That's what our prayer life with God should feel like! Yes, those conversations can be tough, heart-to-
