Beginning of Prayer of the Day for All Saints Sunday

Dear Folks,

It is not unusual for me to take some time to walk through the Summer Hill Cemetery. It's a quiet, peaceful walk and you can almost always count on seeing some wildlife. But what particularly holds my thoughts as I walk are the lives of those who are buried there. From the simplest early stones written in German that shows the wear of time to a more elaborate modern stones etched with a scene, the rows upon rows of stones stand as witness to those who have gone before us. People whose lives touched our lives. People we have loved and even those who we did not know.

The fact that I recognize more names than I did in the past speaks to the length of my tenure at St. Paul's. As I read the names on the stones, I recall faces and the unique personalities that they were. I remember where their favorite pew was in the church and can almost see them sitting there. I remember how they would greet me and whether they sat with family or alone. For some, I think about the conversations we had when they were homebound. The fears, joys, or regrets shared, even the prayers requested. As I read the names and remember their lives, I give a prayer of thanks to God for their life and the witness they made to their faith and the church. Each of us is influenced by those who have gone before us, no matter how long or short a life. Both our families and our

church are molded and shaped by our dearly departed loved ones.

During this time of year, as the darkness of the season grows, we celebrate All Saints Sunday on the first Sunday of November. It is a day that we remember those who have died within the last year with special prayers and remember many of our loved ones no matter what time has past during the distribution of Holy Communion.

All Saints Sunday stands as a reminder of our mortality, of our limited time on earth. But it is reminds us that Jesus promises an end to our tears and sadness. In the midst of that promise, we give thanks for our loved ones' witness to the faith in Jesus Christ. For it is that faith in which we proclaim in the midst of death, Jesus conquered death and burst forth with new life, an eternal life. Death may be a part of life, but because Jesus died on the cross, it does not have the final word. Jesus Christ saw to that.

While those who have died no longer live an earthly life, they have been granted a seat at that heavenly feast where there is no longer grief nor pain or sorrow. We may visit the graves of our dearly departed loved ones to honor their life, but Christ forever has knit us together in that one communion, the body of Christ. As we remember and give thanks to those who have died, let us celebrate God's gracious gift of life eternal.
