Dear Parents,

Drivers will make every effort to drive safely and to encourage good student behavior on the bus. Students must be responsible for their conduct on the bus so nothing they do will distract the driver, risk their own safety or the safety of others.

The bus driver has full responsibility and authority for the safety of students while they are being transported on an Elko County School District bus. The following expectations have been developed for the safety of students while on or around a bus, and for the bus to be operated in a safe manner.

Loading the Bus

- 1. Be five minutes early to loading area and stay in area.
- 2. Line up in single file when bus is approaching.
- 3. Remain in line until bus is fully stopped, the door is open, and the driver directs you to load.
- 4. Load in an orderly manor (walking and keeping hands and objects to yourself, no pushing or shoving)
- 5. Go directly to your assigned seat.

Unloading the Bus

- 1. Remain seated until the bus comes to a full stop.
- 2. Exit the bus according to the driver's directions.
- 3. Go straight home after you get off the bus.

Recognition for Good Behavior

Research has repeatedly demonstrated that recognition of good behavior is the best way to shape behavior. Bus drivers should strive to have positive interactions with each student. This will be done by the bus driver greeting students by name, praising them for following the rules, recognizing a Student of the Week, and giving out Caught Being Safe Tickets.

Consequences from Bus Driver

Bus driver will handle minor behavior problems in a professional manner. All consequences will involve the re-teaching of bus expectations. The following consequences may be used.

Reviewing rules with bus driver

Assigned seating

Conference with bus driver

Note to parent to re-teach rules

Parent contact

Written contract with bus driver/parent

Other consequences deemed appropriate

Consequences from School Administrator

If minor behavior continues or if student behavior is deemed a major offense, the bus driver will write a Bus Conduct Report and the school administrator will handle further consequences according to district policy and teaching of appropriate behavior. Parent will be notified and receive a copy of the report. The following consequences may be use:

School administration conference and teaching of acceptable behavior.

Bus Safety Class

Suspension of from (1 to 90 days)

Other consequences deemed appropriate
