"Jesus said to his disciples: "You have heard that it was said, An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth. But I say to you, offer no resistance to one who is evil. When someone strikes you on your right cheek, turn the other one as well. If anyone wants to go to law with you over your tunic, hand over your cloak as well. Should anyone press you into service for one mile, go for two miles. Give to the one who asks of you, and do not turn your back on one who wants to borrow. "You have heard that it was said, You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy. But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father, for he makes his sun rise on the bad and the good, and causes rain to fall on the just and the unjust. For if you love those who love you, what recompense will you have? Do not the tax collectors do the same? And if you greet your brothers only, what is unusual about that? Do not the pagans do the same? So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect."

Eucharistic Renewal Meditation

"The question I want to pose is how can we become once again capable of symbols? How can we again know how to read them and be able to live them? We know well that the celebration of the sacraments, by the grace of God, is efficacious in itself (ex opere operato), but this does not guarantee the full engagement of people without an adequate way of their placing themselves in relation to the language of the celebration. A symbolic "reading" is not a mental knowledge, not the acquisition of concepts, but rather a living experience. Above all we must reacquire confidence about creation. I mean to say that things — the sacraments "are made" of things — come from God. To Him they are oriented, and by Him they have been assumed, and assumed in a particular way in the Incarnation, so that they can become instruments of salvation, vehicles of the Spirit, channels of grace. 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Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Pius And St Anthony Churches,

7th Sunday Ordinary Year A

Matthew 5:38-43

"Turn the other cheek-walk the extra mile and give the shirt off your back". We've all heard those phrases. They are the response of Jesus to insults, requests or demands. Jesus asks us to respond this way, too, when we face difficult situations like being struck/insulted by someone, forced to do something we don't like or unreasonably being asked for more than normally expected. These responses call us to go beyond what the world would do. The world would react to these situations by hitting them back, watching them fall or telling them "tough luck"! Jesus wants His followers to act more gracefully and to take the higher road. For example, Jesus asks us to respond to insults by smiling back (turn the cheek to let them see you smile). Also, we should freely and joyfully walk with the 'demanding' person, instead of grudgingly being 'forced to' carry their burden with them. And if we are asked for our jacket, then we should offer them our custom-fit shirt as well, for they 'must' need it more than we do. In the introduction to His Sermon on the Mount, Jesus had said that He expects more from His followers, than anyone else. Back in Mathew 5:20, He said, "Your holiness must surpass that of the Pharisees." He is saying that His disciples have been taught better (by Him). He desires that His followers should love and serve others better, because of His grace and example. We can give more than expected because He has taught us (we are His). Further, Jesus is reminding us that if someone is insulting, pushy or demandingly selfish toward us, then apparently they have not been taught any better. So, Jesus says, "Teach them a lesson" (but no, not like that sounded!) Jesus means that we should show them what a gracious and kind person looks like-show them how a loving Christian interacts with other people, even difficult people. If they attack, show them patience. If they 'make' you walk with them, show them you are stronger and you'd do it willingly. If they are demanding of your stuff, give it to them, to show that you love them as a person more than your jacket or shirt.

But we might say after being insulted or put upon, "I can't do that – they burn me up". Well, in that case, we need to stick around Jesus a little longer to absorb more of His grace to be stronger than our attackers or insulters. Sometimes after hearing these sacrificial responses Jesus calls us to demonstrate, people reject it saying, "Well that 'turn you cheek' stuff is for weak people" But I suggest we try doing it before thinking it is weak. It takes a strong sense of character to love someone who is rude or demanding. We must have a deep self-esteem to be able to love someone respectfully, even when we are attacked. Does someone think it is easy to 'smile when being insulted' or to give willingly to someone for whom 'nothing is ever enough'? Or to accept patiently the burden of spending a little more time walking farther with a grouch or complainer? Just try it, if you think only wimps can do it. It takes great inner strength to keep a peaceful composure when being insulted or being imposed on unjustly.

One way of approaching such 'Extreme Love' Christianity as this, is to consider that you are helping that other person to overcome their own weakness. For example, just grant it for a moment and assume that they are a 'bad' person. Okay. Now, how do we suppose they are ever going to become good, if they aren't shown it by someone being 'better'? How can they ever be good if they do not receive such loving interaction from someone else, or have it shown to them by a good person's example? They can't practice until they are shown it. It can be instructive to us and make us better too, if we give back to others much better treatment than they gave to us. We don't want to let them teach us to be like them (negative and pushy), but rather we should patiently teach and practice more loving responses to give to them.

But we still may say, "I don't know how to love in such ways." That makes me remember when I was a kid and mom would say, "Brian make your bed". I didn't want to, so I tried the excuse, "I don't know how." That excuse only works one time! She would step in, show me how to tuck in the sheets, fold back the covers, pack the pillows and place the quilt on top of it all. Then she said, "Now you know-I know you know how because I just showed you." Jesus can do the same with us, when we say "I don't know how to love back a difficult person." Well, Jesus' whole life shows us: every interaction he had in the gospels is what we should model our lives on following.
