Dear Pastors and Principals:

The Archdiocese of Washington Board of Education is seeking additional members for 2020-2021, and would welcome your nomination of a parishioner, parent, teacher, who you believe would bring experience and a commitment to excellence in Catholic education. We are looking for individuals with diverse backgrounds and professional experiences that can provide valuable perspectives in the examination of the educational opportunities and issues confronting the Catholic Schools. It is our goal to have a collective group that will consider all stakeholders' perspectives in this advisory capacity. This year, we are seeking nominations from Montgomery, Prince George's, Southern Maryland (Calvert, Charles, and St. Mary's counties) and welcome your recommendations.

The archdiocesan Board of Education meets every month, during the third week, at the Archdiocesan Pastoral Center, during the school year. Our meetings begin at 6:00 p.m. and conclude no later than 8:00 p.m. We also offer the option of remote participation, for meeting. The term of a member of the Board of Education is three years and may be renewed for a second term. All candidates are nominated by their pastors or principals, interviewed by the board's nomination committee, and finally, recommended for appointment by the full board. The appointment is confirmed by the Archbishop.
