Church Council Minutes

The Trinity United Church of Christ, Elliston Church Council met on December 12th, 2016 at 7:00 pm. Amy Mathews, President called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. and Steve Turnow opened with prayer. Those in attendance were as follows:

President – Amy Mathews, Vice President – Ed Gahler, Recording Secretary – Desirae McCloskey, Financial Secretary, Nyla Denman, Elders - Connie Gahler and Ken Gahler, Trustees – Marty Hoeft, and Dale Bodnar, Deacons – Dwayne Hoeft and Jim Buhro

Secretary Rhonda Mahoney and Pastor Kyle was present as well.

John Bast and Dan Gahler from the 2017 council slate were also in attendance.

Not Present – Trustee Doug Avery **Reports:**

Recording Secretary:

Meeting minutes from the council meeting on 11/14/2016 were read prior the meeting. Motion to accept the minutes for the past meeting was made by Ed Gahler, 2^{nd} by Dwayne Hoeft. MC.

Meeting minutes from the congregational meeting on 12/4/2016 were read prior to the meeting. A discussion was held relative to amending the constitution in order to allow a council member to continue on council for an additional two year term, council has determined at this time that we will not amend the constitution, in hopes that someone will step up and fill the Vice President role. Motion to accept the congregational minutes* was made by Nyla Denman, 2^{nd} by Jim Buhro. MC. *Council still voted on minutes due to the accuracy of the meeting minutes, although discussion by council after the congregational meeting will take precedence.

Secretary Report:

- Check from the sale of the parsonage has been received by the church. Marty Hoeft made a motion to deposit the check into the 'Genoa Estate Savings'. The 'Genoa Estate Savings' will then be changed to 'Genoa Savings' with subcategories (Estate and Parsonage). Additionally, the parsonage balance will then be moved to that savings account as well. 2nd by Nyla Denman. MC.
- NWO Association UCC has asked for our mission goal for 2017, we will follow the approved budget for the giving to the association.
- Committee reports are due by the end of December.

Financial Report:

- Financial information was reviewed for the prior month. Dale Bodnar moved to accept the financial report. Connie Gahler 2nd. MC.
- An audit needs to be completed for the last six months of 2016, it will be performed in January 2017.

Pastor Report:

- Discussed the two Christmas Eve services, communion will be served at both services.
- Wednesday Re-Kindle services attendance has been low, it was discussed regarding continuing or postponing to Lenten services. It was decided to keep it on the calendar in hopes that attendance picks up.
- Year-end review video is being worked on.
- In contact with missions agencies for missions trip in June.
- Road signs will be ready in January.
- Deacons can you please look to see who the greeters are the following week to help reminder next week's greeters of their assignment.
- Benevolence Fund Currently has
 \$1,500 which needs to be given by the

end of 2017. If anyone has any organizations to donate to, please let Rhonda/Kyle know.

- Elevator Update Nothing has been received in regards to the re-buttle of the letter that was received from the church regarding the initial bill to repair the services.
- Floors Still in progress of cleaning the remaining floors – will be done by the end of January.

Committee Reports:

Worship – Nothing to report, as they have not met. **EFY** –Doing fantastic, having 20-26 on average of participants. Still looking for teachers! PLEASE SIGN UP! For all of those interested in teaching either one Sunday or several Sunday. Please sign up outside the door.

Christmas Program organized by Ashley Zimmerman was great and was well attended. Dinner was excellent led by Amy Mathews, which fed approximately 130 individuals. Income for the evening was \$725, once the expenses have been paid, the remainder will be given to the EFY fund. However, an individual has stepped up to cover the expenses, therefore the total amount given will be deposited into the youth group.

Mission – Assisted with the Christmas Program dinner, was very successful.

Church & Ministry – Nothing to report, as they have not met.

Trustees -

- It was determined that Pastor Kyle will be in charge of contacting snow removal contact on an as needed basis as we head into the wintery season.
- Basement wall in the stairwell is getting fixed this week.
- Basement floors and walls need to be kept on the radar as the basement could use some sprucing up.
- Kitchen needs caulking all along the backsplash.
- Light sensors outside coming in to the church are not coming on.
- Nativity scene was set up by the trustees (and Ed Gahler).

Parsonage Committee - Parsonage has been sold, final check received was \$98,431.77 after closing costs and miscellaneous expenses.

Window Project – Earliest they would be able to come out is February 2017. Council has determined that isn't the best time for Ohio weather, therefore, will be contacted the company to reschedule as we get close to the February date.

Old Business:

- 15 tables have been purchased by the church
- Ed Gahler contacted Bob Jenson for annual maintenance of the front door proposing we have redone in March.

New Business:

- Parsonage garage needs to be cleaned out will be looking into what to alternative storage considerations we have at this time.
- Custodial Position: Ed Gahler presiding as President (as Amy was not in attendance during this item): Jim Buhro made a motion of accepting Amy Mathews to be the custodian of the church, Dale Bodnar 2nd. MC.

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
