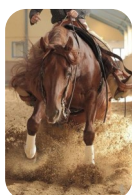

HEROES

General Rules for Exhibit Open Class:

- 1) Exhibitors may enter only two items in each class per person.
- 2) An entry form must be completely filled out for all entries.
- 3) All items must be produced or prepared within the current fair year (August 2020-August 2021)
- 4) Entries are limited to Beaver County residents. Non-residents may enter items as display only.
- 5) The Beaver County Fair Board will not be responsible for any lost, stolen, or damaged items. All reasonable means will be taken to prevent loss or damage.
- 6) All items will be received from 2:00pm to 8:00pm on Tuesday, August 24, at the Fairgrounds, with the exception of produce and flower entries, which will be accepted on Wednesday, August 25 8:00am-11:00am.
- 7) Judging of entries will be on Wednesday, August 25th
- 8) The exhibit building will be open on Thursday, August 26th from 2:00pm-7:00pm, Friday, August 27th from 1:00pm-7:30pm, and Saturday, August 28th from 10:00am-7:00pm
- 9) Exhibits will be judged and ribbons awarded in blue or red ribbons. Cash premiums of \$3.00 for blue ribbons and \$2.00 for red ribbons will be awarded.
- 10) Rosette ribbons will be awarded \$15.00 for Grand Champion, and \$10 for Reserve Champion or Judges Choice. There is a \$50.00 maximum on premium money awarded for open class exhibits, excluding rosette premiums. All items not claimed will become the property of the Beaver County Fair Board.

Floyd and Elizabeth Yardley of Beaver have been chosen to be the Grand Marshals for the Beaver County Fair 2021. Floyd and Elizabeth have been Hometown Heroes in Beaver County. Some acts of service are seen and hundreds have been unseen. Elizabeth and her family were outvoted at the fairboard meeting when the Grand Marshals were selected but it is a well-deserved honor. They are the parents of 7 children and 30 grandchildren.

Elizabeth started in 1980 volunteering at the Beaver County Fair. She served in the presidency of the fair, with other dedicated volunteers, boosting the attendance. For the last 13 years Elizabeth has been the chair of the children's day activities, helped with set up, volleyball in the middle of the night, fundraising, games, concessions, senior day, the livestock show and cleanup. Floyd has been a member of the rodeo committee running the chutes, calves or return gate for 13 years. Floyd has

also brought his kids and grandkids to participate in the livestock show for 40+ years. Elizabeth was chosen as the outstanding volunteer for the Utah Fairs and Events Association in 2012.

Floyd is a local rancher providing quality beef. He served on the Soil Conservation board for 42 years. Floyd was honored for the National Day of the American Cowboy in 2011. The Utah Cattlemen's Association awarded the Lifetime Legacy Award to Floyd and his brothers Calvin & Dale in 2019. Elizabeth worked at Beaver Valley Hospital, directed many plays through Beaver Civic Arts, served in the Beaver Betterment Club and as president for the club. She was selected Beaver Betterment Woman of the Year in 2006. They have served in their church and community events for over 50 years.

Floyd and Elizabeth are "Hometown Heroes" of Beaver County. We thank them for their contributions to both the Beaver County Fair, and their dedication to making life better for all those around them!
