IN THE HOSPITALITY INDUSTRY



RESTAURANTS

- Wear protective gear, such as, cut-resistant gloves, aprons, and oven mitts
- Keep knives sharp and in proper knife racks
- Use brooms and not hands to remove broken glass
- Wear slip-resistant shoes
- Identify and eliminate potential hazards, such as, slippery floors
- Check machines to make sure they work properly
- Use appliance thermometers to confirm that the machines are reaching the necessary temperatures
- Check glassware routinely for cracks and chips
- Pick up spilled foods immediately
- Use caution signs when floors are wet
- Make sure that electrical cords do not create trip hazards
- Stack supplies immediately – do not leave boxes in walkways
- Train employees on the proper methods of serving flaming dishes
- Report any safety hazard or fire immediately
- Do not block access to fire-fighting equipment or fire exits
- Learn the location of fire exits and fire extinguishers
- In case of fire, turn off all electrical equipment and walk to the nearest exit

HOTELS

- Clear drive-up areas, sidewalks, and lobby floors of trip hazards
- Clearly mark glass doors with stickers or signage
- Keep housekeeping and room service carts out of walkways
- Train employees on safe mattress turning and lifting procedures
- Instruct laundry attendants in the proper handling of chemicals
- Maintain proper lighting and ventilation in all areas of the garage
- Notify room service employees of floor cleaning and carpet repair
- Clear stairs, corridors, and elevator landings of trip hazards
- Trim plants along travel paths
- Regularly monitor the pool and adjacent area
- Regularly monitor the fitness club's equipment

GOLF & COUNTRY CLUBS

- Wear eye protectors when operating power tools
- Wear sunglasses when working in direct sunlight
- Wear hearing protectors when working in noisy environments or operating gas-powered equipment
- Wear respirators when applying pesticides or painting
- Wear safety footwear if lifting heavy objects
- Wear hard hats when trimming trees or when play is underway
- Check all tools for damage or defects
- Properly store tools when not in use
- Provide cart operation safety training to all new employees
- Drive over steep or uneven terrain with caution
- Lock brake before exiting cart or mower

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
