It is with great sadness that I have to report that the 28th annual Letter Carriers' Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive, scheduled for May 9, 2020, has been postponed. The NALC, as well as our national partners, are fully committed to rescheduling the food drive later in 2020. A new date has not yet been scheduled.

The annual success of the food drive is largely due to the efforts of letter carriers, other postal employees, postal customers, community volunteers and many more. Their safety is of utmost importance. As of this writing, much of the United States is currently under shelter in place or similar advisories due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and public health authorities such as the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) have issued guidelines that include social distancing. COVID-19 situation to make sure we're doing the right thing for the communities we serve. This includes working closely with public health experts and other advisors as well as adhering to CDC and OSHA guidance and following state governmental declarations of emergency and stay-at-home orders.

We are working hard to make sure our customers receive the highest quality customer service and that there are minimal service disruptions during this time, however the surge in residential curbside recycling and waste collections has presented unique challenges and caused us to temporarily modify our curbside collection services.

Over the last 30 days, we realigned and reprioritized our collection routes. This reprioritization resulted in the temporary suspension of bulk and yard waste in select markets to ensure that our teams could effectively handle that additional volume in waste and recycling.

**We have been able to handle the significant volume increase, and today we announce that effective Monday April 27, we are reinstating bulk and yard waste collection services in your community.** The following will provide your residents guidelines on how we will move forward with those services

• All items that are not carted will be required to be bagged and sealed

• Recycling must be contained in

the cart

• We still may need to use alternative disposal methods if their disruptions to recycling processing capabilities or if recycling contamination continues to increase. It is important to keep waste out of your recycling container and Do not bag your recyclables

• Yard waste must be bagged in large brown bags (i.e. Home Depot/Lowes) or personal marked yard waste containers under 50 pounds

• Sticks bund led no longer than 4ft and 4 inches in diameter and no heavier than 50 pounds

• Bulk Furniture needs to be wrapped mattresses need to be placed in mattress bags

• Carpeting needs to be in strips at 8in diameter rolled up and no

longer than 4ft

• We may see a surge of material initially that takes us a little longer to collect and clear than normal and if we do we will tag it and send a separate truck to service.

At this point, I do not know if the pool will open. We are waiting on directives from the state and county health departments. As soon as we are given an okay to open we will make the pool available to you.

Two other events without a firm start date are the Miracle League and the Farm Market. As soon as we receive word that these activities may resume, we will pass that on to you.

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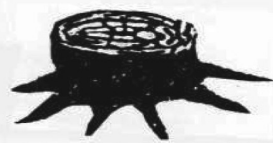
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# Lakeland Helps Students Keep College Plans on Track in Uncertain Times

Even if we could all get out there is no job to go back to. The bills will not stop. At some point, the utility companies will be able to disconnect service, the cost of food will skyrocket, collection activity/harassment will increase dramatically and so will stress caused illness. If you are one of the many people, whose bottom is about to fall out there is still hope. Do not allow yourself to lose your health (or, maybe, even your life over financial stress) because if that happens you will not be able to fix your life. If you are healthy and maintain right thinking you will come out of this OK. I have seen it work thousands of time. 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# The Importance of Advance Directives

I am not an attorney so please do not mistake this for legal advice. However, I believe everyone should put their health care decisions in writing and select a person to act on their behalf, just in case they are ever unable to speak for themselves. You can do this by preparing a set of formal documents referred to as Advance Directives stating your wishes. In most cases, your Advance Directives will include:

A **Living Will** which states what life sustaining medical treatments you would want or refuse if your life is in jeopardy and you are unable to express your wishes.

A **Health Care or Medical Power of Attorney or Durable Power of Attorney for Health Care** which names a specific person to represent you. This document gives this person the rights to:

- Make medical decisions that

are not covered in your living will

- Enforce your healthcare wishes in court if necessary
- Hire and fire doctors and medical workers overseeing your treatment

- Access medical records
- Provide visitation rights

Your representative cannot contradict the terms of your Living Will. Also, a physician and a second doctor must both conclude you are unable to make your own decisions before the Medical Power of Attorney goes into effect.

Once you prepare your Advance Directives, it will be up to you to share these documents with your family, your medical team and those who will be entrusted to carry out your directives.

Directives can be revoked or replaced at any time as long as you are capable of making your own decisions. It is recommended that you review your documents occasionally to ensure that they continue to accurately reflect your wishes.

You can download Advance Directive forms online or contact your local office on aging, your state health department or an attorney to learn more.

No one wants to envision a time when they are unable to make their own health care decisions. But, having your Advance Directives in place offers some assurance that there is someone you trust who will do the best to honor your wishes.
