

## Winter Weekend at Camp Horseshoe!

On a cool Friday evening a full bus of scouts and adults headed down to Camp Horseshoe for our annual Troop 78 winter camp at Browning Lodge. After a one hour bus ride, we arrived at camp. Everyone quickly rushed to secure a bunk on the upper level of the Browning Lodge. We had a snack of chili and cookies and then went to bed for the night.

The next morning we woke up to the sound of sizzling sausages as breakfast was being prepared. Once everyone was up and ready for the day we had a breakfast of sausage, pancakes, and assorted cereals. Then each patrol received scavenger hunt Part One to work on before siesta that day. After breakfast, the troop headed down by the Camp Horseshoe pool to do our annual wood chopping service project for the camp.







This project took up all morning and it snowed while we chopped and stacked the wood. By the end of a hard morning we had chopped up about 6 truck loads of wood. We returned to Browning for the traditional Saturday lunch of grilled cheese and tomato soup. During siesta after lunch the troop handed in scavenger hunt Part One. Then we all received scavenger hunt Part Two to work on and turn in before snack that night.

After siesta, the troop had two advancement periods, the first period was all about merit badges. Some of these merit badges included Pioneering, First Aid, and Citizenship in the Community. Then the second advancement period was either rifle, the camp tour, or just a free period, as it was very gloomy

that afternoon as the snow from that morning had turned into heavy rainfall, advancement period two was not heavily attended. Then after this we had two hours before dinner, so this time was occupied by completing scavenger hunt Part Two.

After dinner we had the Camp Horseshoe winter games where each patrol went around Browning, Kindness, and Schramm Lodges doing different activities to earn their patrol points to be added up at the end of the weekend. ## **Pine Wood Derby Workshop**

On Saturday January 13th, the Scouts of Troop 78 awoke bright and early for an 8:00 AM curtain call at the cabin. They had a long day of designing, cutting, and building pinewood derby cars for an army of Cubs. Scouts mentally prepared themselves for a very hard but fun day of work. The promise of doughnuts and pizza made it much easier to start the day. The first Cubs started arriving around 9:00, where they were paired with an older Scout to assist them in building their cars.

The workshop started with a short instructional video. This

provided the Cubs with crucial information about potential and kinetic energy while also engaging the Scouts and making it fun. It also provided all of the basic knowledge required to build a pinewood derby champion. The next stage involved the design process of their cars. While some Cubs came prepared with a design or theme, others needed some prompting before settling on a design. After landing on their design, older Cubs were shown how to use hand tools and saws to cut out their cars while younger Cubs were brought to the bandsaw manned by Mr. Duff to make the cutting process easier. This was only the first stage of building the cars. Troop 78 Scouts then helped them sand their axles to reduce friction. After the lengthy process of sanding the wheels, they helped the Cubs to add weight to their cars. We did this in a variety of ways such as drilling, shaving, and cutting weights. After preparing them with everything they needed to build their cars, we sent them home to paint and assemble.

We had amazing attendance from both our volunteers and Cubs. This gave us an extremely busy schedule for most of the day. However, Scouts also found the time to build their own cars and hold their own small pinewood derby. This has been a tradition of the Scouts since the inception of the workshop. Overall, it was an amazing day for both volunteers and Cubs.

### In Memoriam: Remembrance

#### **Bennett Roderick Krusen**

- Former Troop 78 Member

In late October of 2023, our community was saddened to learn of the passing of Bennett Roderick Krusen at the age of 15. Bennett joined Troop 78 after crossing over from Pack 151 at their Blue and Gold ceremony on Saturday, 2 March 2019 at the Advent Lutheran Church. He was an active member of our Troop for two years until deciding to pursue other activities due to the pandemic and changing personal priorities.



During his time with the troop, Bennett gained a reputation for being a boy who loved the outdoors, insects, plants, gadgets, and anything technological or scientific. Ben could hyper-focus on details which led him to marvel at things in nature that others overlooked such as a salamander sunning itself on a rock. Bennett was able to capture a turtle at summer camp which he proudly submitted as a troop entry for the Turtle Derby.

Bennett had a sharp mind, and a strong will, and was never shy to speak up. Upon arriving at summer camp for the first time, he stated that he did not want to take a cold outdoor shower, which was required to enter the pool for the swim test. However, the next time at camp, he lead the troop to the pool and was at the head of the line for the pool shower. Bennett really came into his own in many ways in his brief and all too short two years with the troop.

Bennett selected Troop 78 because he loved to go camping due to his enthusiasm and love of nature. He rarely, if ever, missed a trip. He went on the challenging trips even though he knew the events would push him out of his comfort zone. His admiration of nature and the outdoors seemed to outweigh his discomfort on many outings, even if sometimes by only a little bit. His favorite trip was the Beach Trip where after a day of fun on the beach, he procured a laser pointer from the local Boardwalk which seemed powerful enough to burn his name onto the passenger planes passing overhead. He was kind enough to stop that experiment when asked. While he could be a selective eater when assessing food on camping trips, he enjoyed some meals with significant enthusiasm and was happy to give details on why it was excellent.

Bennett's time with our Troop, like his life, was too brief. He will be remembered by the boys and adult leaders of the Troop as a very enthusiastic and passionate scout, persevering in both activities that were his favorite and those that challenged him and were still important to do.

In addition to his parents, Sheila Krusen and Craig Krusen, Bennett Rodrick Krusen was survived by his brother, Carter David Krusen; his maternal grandfather, L. Richard Brown; his paternal grandmother, Linda M. Krusen; his aunt, Nancy Wick (Bobby); his uncles, Jason Krusen (Julie), Scott Brown (Heidi), David Brown (Kate), and Tim Brown (Julie); and twelve loving cousins. He was predeceased by his maternal grandmother, Sandra L. Brown, and his paternal grandfather, A. Larry Krusen, and his uncle, Brian R. Krusen.
