COLD WAR THAWS



SDI - STRATEGIC DEFENSE INITIATIVE "STAR WARS" - Reagan's plan to build a high-tech system of lasers and particle beams to shoot down Soviet missiles before they could reach the United States.

GORBI'S NEW POLICIES IN THE SOVIET UNION:

GLASNOST - "openness" desire to end repression and move toward greater political freedom in the Soviet Union.

PERESTROIKA - "restructuring" of Soviet economy by introducing some free-market practices.

REAGAN GORBACHEV SUMMITS

1985-1988 - Reagan and Gorbachev being a series of "summits" to discuss nuclear disarmament, goes well, the two men begin to develop what will become a true friendship. They will meet for three more summits. In the end, both sides make significant concessions to achieve their goals on arms control issues.

START I - 1991 agreement between Bush and Gorbachev agree to reduce the number of nuclear warheads to 10,000 for each nation

START II - 1992 agreement between Bush and Yeltsin agree to reduce the number of nuclear warheads to 3.000 for each nation

COLLAPSE OF SOVIET COMMUNISM

1989 - POLAND - Free elections held, communist party ousted from power with the election of Lech Wales. Many Eastern European nations follow suit.

1990 - Germany reunited, Berlin Wall comes down.

DEC. 1991 - Soviet Union Dissolved, Gorbachev out. Boris Yeltsin in. Commonwealth of Independent States formed, Communist party disbanded, attempt to embrace democracy and freemarket economy

REAGONOMICS SUPPLY SIDE ECONOMICS

Tax cuts and reduced government spending would increase private sector investments leading to an increase in jobs and prosperity. AKA TRICKLE-DOWN **ECONOMICS.** Opposite of **KEYNESIAN** ECONOMICS.

ECONOMIC RECOVERY ACT 1981

25% decrease in personal income tax over three years, cut corporate income tax, capital, gains tax, and inheritance taxes.

SPENDING CUTS and DEREGULATION:

- support from the BOLLWEEVILS (southern dems)
- \$40 Billion from domestic programs
- NO cuts to Medicare or Social Security
- HUGE INCREASE in military spending (offset any gains from other cuts)
- Deregulated many industries and businesses to help ease costs and stimulate economic growth (banking, auto, environmental protection, corporate mergers)
- Deficit triples (\$900 billion)

EFFECTS OF REAGANOMICS

- U.S. deficit triples (\$2.7 trillion)
- First time since WWI, U.S. becomes a debtor nation
- stimulated increased spending, not investing, led to trade increased trade deficits
- reduced spending on government programs and entitlements

CONSERVATIVE RESURGENCE

- Coalition of economic, political, and religious conservatives opposed to the ideas of New Deal liberalism and Great Society welfare (wanted less involvement by the federal government).
- Feared undermining of family and religious values, work ethic, and national security.

NORTH ATLANTIC FREE TRADE AGREEMENT (NAFTA)

Created a free trade zone with Canada and Mexico

WAR ON TERROR

9/11/2001 Terrorists hijacked four U.S. commercial airliners, flying two into the World Trade Center in NYC, one into the Pentagon in Washington DC, one crashed in a field in Pennsylvania after passengers derailed the hijackers desires to fly into the White House or the U.S. Capital.

USA PATRIOT ACT passed by Congress permitting law enforcement to conduct surveillance on American citizens without their knowledge in order to collect information on possible terrorist activities (wire tapping, email, ect.). Directly led to the creation of the **DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY** cabinet position

established to organize the protection of the U.S. borders and locate potential terrorist threats.

PATIENT PROTECTION AND AFFORDABLE HEALTH CARE ACT

Legislation assed in March of 2010, nicknamed "Obamacare", required all Americans to purchase health care insurance and required states to establish exchanges individuals could purchase coverage at reasonable rates. The law also provided subsidies for poor and low income Americans to purchase insurance.
