How will the **Finish It Up** Challenge work?

- 1. Use one of the forms in this newsletter, or the form of your choice, to record all your UFOs. I will have a limited number of copies at this month's meeting and you are welcome to take one if you couldn't access the site or had problems printing.
- 2. Bring your list(s) to the January and February meeting to have me initial them.
- 3. Work on any UFOs you want in any month that you want.
- 4. Bring your finished projects to Show & Tell each month so that you can bask in the accolades of your peers.
- 5. The challenge will run from our January meeting to our October meeting. If you complete at least 6 UFOs within that time-frame, your name will be entered into our prize drawing.

To answer a few questions, A UFO is an UnFinished Object at any stage of construction. A UFO is **not** a kit that has not been cut into. A UFO does not have to be a quilt but any quilty object a quilter might make i.e., tree skirts, wall hangings, lap quilts, table runners, etc. Please bring any other questions to our meeting because someone else might be wondering the same thing!

This month's program will be our annual Then & Now presentation. Our four members that have volunteered to present are: Linda Artmann, Debbie Blaustein, Stacy Gavin, and Rachel Riley. Our group of quilters range from the long time and very experienced to a relative new quilter who is just starting out. Hospitality

At this month's meeting we have an important vote for where and how we'll be donating our hospitality food items. If you recall, we had a robust discussion back in October and decided to table our decision until this month.

Here are the options we were considering:

- We continue to choose a monthly item or food category to be donated to the Racine County Food Pantry January - October with a cash donation in November.
- We donate a monthly food choice donation to The Marketplace of the Tiny House Village for Veterans. These items are available for free to area vets and or their spouses who use The Marketplace when they identify as "food insecure." We then can opt to donate cash donations in November to either the The Marketplace or the Racine County Food Pantry.
- We donate a monthly food choice to The Marketplace or The Racine County Food Pantry, depending on the month. The collected cash donation in November would be split between the two charities.

There can be amendments added to these options but these are the basic choices we'll be reviewing for our meeting.

This Month's Donation:

Also, for this month, regardless of our vote, we're asking for **SHELF STABLE MILK**. This is seen as a premium item for the pantry because of the expense for most food pantry patrons. Depending on the store, these products can be found in the aisles by the cereal, juice, coffee, or hot chocolate! You gotta SEARCH! Shelf stable milk includes: Powdered dry milk (Found at the Piggly Wigglys), Almond milk* (on shelves at most grocery stores), Rice milk, or Oat milk.

Please do NOT include: evaporated milk or coconut milk!

*If you'd like to make a cash contribution towards shelf stable milk, Sue Causey has volunteered to purchase cases of almond milk from Costco-- a case of 6 cartons can be purchased for under \$10 - versus 1 carton for \$3 at most grocery stores. We'll have a specific envelope for milk donations.

2023 Charity Quilt Donation Report

Lighthouse, Peaceful and Rainbow Quilters donated a total of 273 quilts in 2023 recorded by Barbara Vallone! I am sure more were given by many of you as well as more have been stored by many of you!!!

- 81 Racine Foster Children!
- 55 St Monica's and other local needs in Racine AND Kenosha
- 14 NICU at All Saints ~ 36x36 Isolet blankets
- **14 Union Grove Veterans Home ~ Regina's Lighthouse Project**
- 77 Camp Serenity
- 16 Quilts for Soldiers (sent with the Camp Serenity Quilts)
- 16 Children's Hospital, Milwaukee

273 TOTAL GIVEN out in 2023 and I still have lots of quilts waiting for when we will again need about 80+ for Camp Serenity plus all the other places!!

The estimated total of 273 given quilts is over **\$95,500**!!! This total includes fabric used and time served! Pretty amazing!!

We did a good job in 2023 for Racine Foster Kids Program, Camp Serenity, Wounded Warriors, local veterans and MANY other places in Racine and Kenosha Counties so keep making quilts in sizes 36 x 36 to 60 x 70! We also pray that 2024 will keep us ALL safe with time to use our stash and skill to meet the needs of others!

TC Wiley for Foster Children's Project: Baby to Large Lap—40x40 to 55x70

Barbara Vallone for Quilts for the Community which includes:

All Saints NICU, Racine, and Children's Hospital, Milwaukee: Baby to Lap size--36x36 to 55x70 St. Monica's, Habitat for Humanity and other local needs: Small Lap--45x50 to Nap Lap--55x70 Operation Snuggles – quilts for soldiers' children, Camp Serenity, and Wounded Warriors Baby to twin bed 36x36 to 60x75

Quilt size can range from 36 x36 to 60 x 75—see sizes above. Please keep your biggest quilt to twin bed size.

Donations welcome. We hope to see you at the library!




Library Book of the Month

Featured book of the month: The Cat's Meow: Purr-Fect Quilts For Cat Lovers by Janet Kime

There are 18 fantastic feline quilt designs in the book, one even features cats and dogs together! There are cats made from Traditional Log Cabin blocks, a sampler where the body of each of the 15 cats is a different traditional block, cats with bodies made from the traditional Grandmother's fan block, and a two Sunbonnet Sue style quilts where there's a cat in the traditional dress and hat instead of a child.
