GOOD NEIGHBOR ALLIANCE

Provides temporary emergency shelter for men and families with children under the age of 18 years old. There is a 30 day limit. In addition to a place to stay, they offer financial planning, job hunting assistance, saving suggestions and help with finding permanent house. Food is provided for breakfast and snacks and a full meal is available each evening at 6pm. Donations of food items, hygiene items and paper goods are needed on a regular basis.

Associated with the following: COMMODITY FOOD SUPPLEMENTAL PROGRAM—Is now administered by Area Agency On Aging when clients are no longer eligible for WIC. Mainly geared to seniors, 60 years of age and over who are lot income and are considered at risk for malnutrition. Once certified, they receive one food box per month. Sites are Douglas, Wilcox, Bisbee, Benson and Sierra Vista.
