The Chapel forms a quiet restful spot where, before the Blessed Sacrament, one may kneel in supplication and reverence. We are proud of our worshipful Church and invite you to share its benefit. Come in, rest, pray apart from the world. Surely God is in His Holy Temple.

All who confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, have been baptized in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost, are repentant of their sins and believe the Blessed Sacrament to be the true Body and Blood of Christ are invited to receive the Sacrament of the Altar. We hope that you will enter fully into worship by joining in the prayers, responses, and hymns. Because our worship may be unfamiliar to those not raised in the Episcopal Church, feel free to ask the assistance of those around you in following and participating in the liturgy. If you are in search of a church home, we invite you to join us in worship, fellowship, and service. Please sign the guest register at the church entrance so we may have a record of your visit.



RESTORATION NEWS: The A. Pennacchi & Sons stonemasons have completed the restoration and repointing of the north side brownstone wall of the Chapel and Sacristy. The brownstone Chapel coping and the cross have been restored and repointed. The Chapel altar window perimeter was caulked and sealed. The Pennacchi crew also reset and repointed the south side brick foundation of the Rectory. The goals of these projects are to strengthen the structures, stop water infiltration, and to prepare for the plastering and painting of our Church interior. This project is supported by our Capital Fund portion of our Investment Portfolio. We are sincerely grateful for our benefactors whose bequests and contributions have built our Capital Fund.

BUILDING FUND NEWS: Contributions to our non-budget Building Fund have made it possible to contract with Trenton Roofing and Siding to repair the leaking flat tin roof connecting the Church and the Parish House. This project will include the installation of a granule-surfaced flat rubber roofing system with metal edging securing the perimeter. Our Building Fund contributions are also supporting a contract with Liberty Mechanical Services to replace a defective steam trap in our Church steam boiler system. We appreciate and are thankful for our parishioners and friends of Christ Church who contribute to the Building Fund. These contributions are an important way to directly help our Parish.
