On **May 1, 1960** - An American U-2 spy plane piloted by Francis Gary Powers was shot down over Sverdlovsk in Central Russia flying at 60,000 feet.

On May 2, 2011 - United States Special Operation Forces killed Osama Bin Laden during a raid on his secret compound in Abbottabnd, Pakistan.

On May 4, 1494 - During his second journey to the New World, Christopher Columbus discovered Jamaica.

On May 4, 1970 - Four (4) Kent State University students were killed by National Guardsmen who were protesting President Nixon's decision to invade Cambodia.

On May 5, 1865 - Decoration Day was first observed in the United States.

On **May 5, 1961** - Astronaut Alan Shepard became the first man in space, piloting *Friendship 7*, during a 15 minute 28 second suborbital flight that reached an altitude of 116 miles.

On May 6, 1937 - The German Airship *Hindenburg* burst into flames at 7:20 P.M. near Lakehurst, New Jersey. 36 of 97 passengers and crew were killed.

On May 6, 1856 - Explorer Robert E. Peary (1856-1920) was born in Cressan, Pennsylvania.

On May 7, 1915 - the British passenger ship *Lusitania* was torpedoed by a German submarine off the coast of Ireland losing 1,198 of its 1,924 passengers, including 114 Americans.

On May 7, 1833 - Composer Johannes Brahms (1833-1897) was born in Hamburg, Germany.

On May 8, 1884 - President Harry S. Truman was born.

On May 10, 1869 - The newly constructed tracks of the Union Pacific and Central Pacific Railways were first linked at Promontory, Utah.

On May 11, 1969 - During the Vietnam War the Battle of "Hamburger Hill" began.

On May 11, 1888 - Songwriter Irving Berlin (1888-1989) was born.

On May 15, 1972 - George Wallace was shot while campaigning for the Presidency in Laurel, Maryland.

On May 17, 1875 - The first Kentucky Derby Horse race took place.

On May 20, 1932 - Amelia Earhart became the first women to fly solo across the Atlantic.

On May 21, 1881 - The American Red Cross was founded by Clara Barton.

On May 24, 1848 – Telegraph inventor Samuel Morse sent the first telegraph message "What Hath God Wrought?" from the Capitol in Washington, D.C. to Baltimore, Maryland.

On May 27, 1937 - In San Francisco, California, 200,000 people strolling, celebrated the Grand Opening of the Golden Gate Bridge.



Admission, Parking, and Shuttle to the Event are Free


Located in northern Ohio on the shore of Lake Erie in Conneaut. Admission is free but donations are welcome.
