As we look to warmer days, in the Church we are preparing to spiritually enter into Lent, leading to Holy Week, and culminating with Easter. This is the most important time of the year for Christians, as we strive to grow in faith, self-discipline, and love during Lent, and ask God to renew us through the suffering, death, and resurrection of the Lord Jesus.
