

This winter was very cold for an extended period of time. We saw temperatures well below normal, and the low temps held on much longer than is normal. Due to this cold, we have many ornamental plant and shrubs which have been damaged.

We are in the process of assessing the need to replace plantings which were severely damaged or killed outright by the extreme cold weather; we ask that everyone be patient during this spring assessment of the winter damage to plants and shrubs, it is necessary to allow time for any plant or shrub which us still dormant to respond to warmer weather so we do not overspend landscaping budgets replacing plants which my recover.

Additionally, this spring season has allowed only a short time frame to plant grass seed. We will not get the results expected this spring, but will continue to concentrate on grassy area refurbishment this summer (where possible) and continue this fall.

Thanks to all for your understanding while we make the necessary replacements. We will get to all of the planting needs as quickly as possible.


