MICHAEL H. SCHOOR, ESQ.

As a result of over two decades of senior-level Washington legal/legislative experience, Mr. Schoor has counseled and assisted many businesses and other persons wishing to enhance their negotiations or relationships with the Federal government.

Mr. Schoor has worked for many years with and for the decision-makers in Congress, the Executive departments and agencies, the national political parties and the private sector. Because of these experiences, and the close personal relationships forged as a result of these experiences, he possesses a thorough understanding of and a unique ability to influence the legislative, administrative and electoral processes. His capacity to effectively and discreetly assist the decision-makers (and those persons wishing to influence the decision-makers) is well established in the Nation's Capitol. And since he understands the significance of quiet, effective participation in the electoral process, he has consulted with many election campaigns for President, United States Senator, Congressman and Governor. As a result of these many activities, Mr. Schoor is listed in Who's Who of Emerging American Leaders.

While attending law school in the evenings, Mr. Schoor began his professional career in 1968 as a "Doorkeeper" in the United States Senate (a position that provided considerable insight into the legislative process) and a staff assistant to a United States Senator. Following a legislative assignment with the Veterans Administration, he joined the American Dental Association as their senior legislative assistant, where he became expert on national health care policy matters. Building on that base of knowledge, Mr. Schoor later became the business community's chief legislative advocate on health care matters when he served as director of health care policy for the Chamber of Commerce of the United States. While with the Chamber, he was responsible for drafting the business community's national health care legislative bill which was introduced and debated by Congress in 1974 and subsequent years--portions of which have been enacted into law. Because of his expertise as a legislative draftsman, he was asked to return to Capitol Hill to serve as associate legal counsel in the Office of the Law Revision Counsel of the United States House of Representatives, where he was responsible for the "codification" of the nation's transportation laws.

As director of legislative and government affairs for the National Society of Professional Engineers for five years, Mr. Schoor began his long-standing association with the design professions and developed expertise in the laws governing engineering, real estate, construction and federal procurement. While at NSPE, he was

responsible for establishing the Society's political action committee which--under his direction--grew to be one of the nation's largest. The NSPE-PAC provided Mr. Schoor with the opportunity to develop an expertise of those political matters regulated by the Federal Election Commission.

After serving as director of government relations and chief lobbyist for the Associated Builders and Contractors, Mr. Schoor in 1982 established his law practice; in 1988, he established the law firm of Schoor & Partners, P.C., which has offices in Washington, Dallas and Phoenix. As a part of his active federal legal/legislative practice, Mr. Schoor primarily represents members of the savings and loan, banking, housing, and asset management industries before federal departments, regulatory agencies, and Congress. He also represents borrowers wishing to renegotiate loans with federally regulated financial institutions and certain federal agencies owning such loans.

Licensed to practice law both in his home-state of New Mexico and the District of Columbia, Mr. Schoor is a member of the bars of the United States Supreme Court, several United States Courts of Appeal and United States District Courts, and the United States Court of Claims. He is listed in Who's Who of American Lawyers.

Mr. Schoor earned his juris doctor degree from the Georgetown University Law Center in Washington, D.C. where he participated in the Williston on Contracts project. His undergraduate education was received at the University of New Mexico where he was selected for the dean's list. He maintains residences in both Dallas and Washington.
