Thanking Our Veterans - Virtually

The CNY Veterans Parade and Expo was virtual this year, due to the COVID restrictions. Several features were added to CNYVeteransParade.org to help the community remember the importance of honoring our veterans. A recorded interview with students and local veterans by Spectrum was added to the site. Also new is a slideshow by the Onondaga County Historical Association on the War Memorial. While unable to have a full event for the 13th Annual CNY Veterans Parade and Expo, a small socially-distant ceremony was held to honor local veterans at the NYS Fairgrounds Veterans Memorial. The ceremony, which included the Tom Dooley Choraliers, a color guard and firing squad from the VFW 7872 in the Town of Manlius, and a presentation to the Grand Marshal Mark Burns, was live streamed and posted to the site. It was my honor to present Manny Martinez a citation for his 99th birthday at the Pennock Post on Charles Ave in Solvay. Mr. Martinez was the longest serving supervisor in Geddes's history, and was a town councilor and a Solvay village Trustee before that as well. Prior to being an elected official, he was a teacher, athletic director and vice principal at West Genesee for over 30 years. He is a decorated WW2 combat veteran and lifelong Solvay/Geddes resident.



Filling the Void by Opening an Intensive
Outpatient Psychiatric Program for Adolescents

Upstate Medical University held a ribbon cutting for the Intensive Outpatient Psychiatric Program for Adolescents The unit is a successful result of the Mental Health Task Force which Assemblyman Magnarelli helped start in 2015 with Congressman John Katko. Upstate Medical University used the results from the task force and has begun to fill the recognized void by creating clinics for both outpatient and inpatient psychiatric care to children and adolescents in Central New York.



Raising the Flag

Assemblyman Magnarelli brought a flag to the Pompei North
Apartments for display in their center circle. Anne Visconti, a resident, alerted him to the need.

Loretto Opens New Facility for Those with Alzheimer's or Dementia

Assemblyman Magnarelli toured the new Borer Memory Life Community - an \$8 million apartment building for people with dementia at The Nottingham in Jamesville. The facility addresses the growing need to serve and provide facilities for people with dementia and Alzheimer's disease.





Northside Infrastructure Renovations

Mayor Ben Walsh and Assemblyman Magnarelli had a chance to look at renovations done to Grant Boulevard from state funding. Renovations of Grant Boulevard from Wheaton Road to Highland Street included resurfacing, new curbs and renovated corners.

A larger project referred to as "Butternut Street- Dig Once" is being planned for the Northside neighborhood. The project, delayed due to COVID restrictions, will include resurfacing, new curbs and sidewalks and replacement of subsurface sewer and water infrastructure. The project is funded through a \$5.25 million state grant.

Maintaining Neighborhoods; Finding a Home for the Men's Shelter

Assemblyman Magnarelli spoke at a public meeting regarding the proposal to move Catholic Charities men's shelter to 501 W. Genesee St. He spoke against this proposal and on behalf of the residents who have worked so hard to rejuvenate their neighborhood. Having the shelter near Leavenworth Park and residential housing brings risks and challenges that would negate their efforts. Assemblyman Magnarelli is looking to work with Onondaga County Catholic Charities, to help find a suitable location.



Library Funding

Assemblyman Magnarelli announced that Hazard Branch Library has been allocated \$31,635 in state aid for library construction funds. The funds will enable them to renovate the parking lot. The funds are from \$34 million in capital funds for public library construction and broadband infrastructure projects provided in the State Budget



Dome Renovations

Assemblyman Magnarelli toured the Syracuse University Dome to view the latest renovations, including the new roof and center scoreboard with Chancellor Ken Syverud, Vice President of Facilities Pete Sala and Director of Athletics John Wildhack. The \$118-million dollar investment includes the new crowntruss roof and the biggest center-hung scoreboard in college sports with a six-foot ribbon board that runs around the bottom. The building has new LED lighting systems. Renovations to restrooms, concession stands, and air conditioning units are also being completed ahead of schedule due to crowds being prohibited because of COVID.
