Then Jesus said to her in reply, "O woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish." And the woman's daughter was healed from that hour."

Excerpt of 'Canaanite Woman's Faith'

By Barb Messner Some excuse his words as testing power of faith to rise to challenge. Or was this a test of women to reveal their wit and courage and the truth of their potential, once unshackled from supression? We still claim from her responses proof of women's faith and reason long denied by patriarchy. Were the words of their encounter a parable of liberation overturning expectation?

"Even dogs eat crumbs from children!" Deft rebuke in humble answer! We are wrong to use her image in a claim we are unworthy! Jesus gave rare affirmation to her intellect and power: "You speak Logos; you bring healing!" She had healed more than her daughter. Women generations after are empowered by her example. Did the Lord himself find healing in enacting new creation?

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

20th Sunday Ordinary Time Year A

Matthew 15:21-28

"You can call me anything, just don't call me 'late for dinner'!" If the chef's food is that good, I can accept any name calling, to be included among those being served his/her finest of dinners. I think of the faithful woman in the encounter with Jesus in today's gospel. It sure seems like Jesus compares Himself ministering to her, since she is a foreign outsider to Israel (Canaanite woman), similar to taking the family's dinner and throwing it out of the house to dogs in the yard. Jesus says in Matt 15:26, "It is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs." But the strong woman is not deterred from persisting in her request for Jesus' grace, nor is she discouraged by the seemingly racial slur tossed at her. She knows that Jesus is the source of healing and the remedy to her daughter's affliction. This encounter reminds me of the 'Nazi Soup Chef' on Seinfeld, who had such ridiculous rules and legalistic restaurant rituals about being served his famous soup at his bistro. People were willing to put up with the insane procedures to get his most delicious soups (Seinfeld ends up being rejected/ banned from the Soup Nazi's shop for not following the OCD restaurant procedures) I think the Canaanite woman, like the Nazi Soup Bistro customers, are willing to put up with the nonsense, because of the greater good of enjoying some wonderful food (or in the woman's case, her daughter's healing). I can imagine the Canaanite woman saying, "Jesus, say anything you want to me; I don't care what you call me, just heal my girl!" The woman's faith is so strong that she will go through any hardship out of love for her daughter. She will do anything so that her daughter may be healed! The woman actually says, "Please, Lord, for even the dogs eat the scraps that fall from the table of their masters" (Matt 15:27). I imagine the woman thinks to herself, "If I am a dog, then fine, whatever it takes to be close to you Jesus. I'll gladly be called a dog, if it means my daughter's health is restored!" The woman displays such strong faith, that she sees right through the religious bigotry and racist language that seeks to push her away. She is saying, "Label me whatever. I know who I really am, but more importantly I know who you are Jesus, and you are the one who can heal my daughter, so please......"

Jesus praises the woman's faith in Matthew 15:28 "O woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish." This praise for someone's strong faith, is unique from Jesus, similar to the praise Jesus gave the centurion in Matthew 8:10 saying, "Amen, I say to you, in no one in Israel have I found such faith", or how he praised the woman with hemorrhage in Matthew 9:22 "Courage, daughter! Your faith has saved you." Interestingly, such high praise is not ever laid at the feet of his apostles! At least 5 times, Jesus reprimands the apostles with the phrase 'You of little faith' (Matthew 6:30, 8:26, 14:31, 16:8 & 17:20). Yet here, Jesus commends this gentile woman's persistent faith and endurance.

The Canaanite woman reminds me of St Josephine Bakhita, a Sudanese-born woman kidnapped and sold into slavery, who endured unspeakable tortures and abuse as a slave. God's providence led her to be bought by an Italian ambassador in Sudan to serve as a nanny in their family. She returned with the family to Venice and accompanied the daughter to a private school run by the Connosian Sisters. This was her first encounter with the God she had always sought in her own heart's way. She became Catholic and eventually was emancipated (legal case!) and became a Connosian nun. What a master St Bakhita found in Jesus! She certainly knew 'masters' and I imagine her saying, "Jesus, you are the sweetest master, the only master I claim; I joyfully serve you!" In fact, St Bakhita's faith was so strong (again keep in mind all the terrible torment she endured as a female salve), she is known to have said after her conversion to Catholicism, "If I was to meet those slave raiders that abducted me and those who tortured me, I'd kneel down to them to kiss their hand. Because, if it had not been for them, I would not have become a Christian and religious woman. In God's will, there is great peace." That is Faith: Faith like the Canaanite woman who will endure anything out of love to keep near Jesus and be claimed by Him! Christians may undergo persecution and be called many derogatory names, but don't let it ever be said, that we are 'not close to Christ', or that we are not living 'Christ-like' lives (of course, that takes our faith)!
