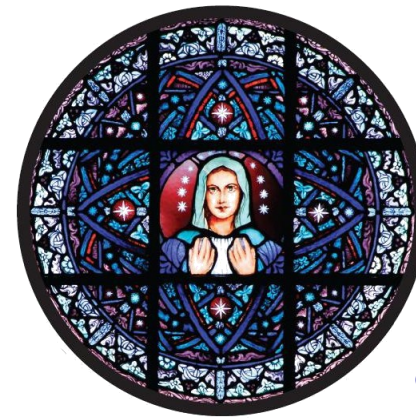

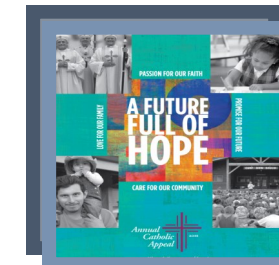

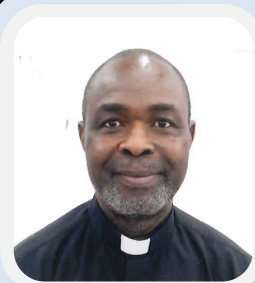

The Different Kinds of Sins

There are a great many kinds of sins. Scripture provides several lists of them. The *Letter to the Galatians* contrasts the works of the flesh with the fruit of the Spirit: "Now the works of the flesh are plain: fornication, impurity, licentiousness, idolatry, sorcery, enmity, strife, jealousy, anger, selfishness, dissension, factions, envy, drunkenness, carousing, and the like. I warn you as I warned you before, that those who do such things shall not inherit the Kingdom of God. Sins can be distinguished according to their objects, as can every human act; or according to the virtues they oppose, by excess or defect; or according to the commandments they violate. They can also be classed according to whether they concern God, neighbor, or oneself; they can be divided into spiritual and carnal sins, or again as sins in thought, word, deed, or omission. The root of sin is in the heart of man, in his free will, according to the teaching of the Lord: "For out of the heart come evil thoughts, murder, adultery, fornication, theft, false witness, slander. These are what defile a man." But in the heart also resides charity the source of the good and pure works, which sin wounds.

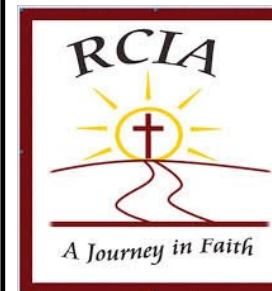
BLOOD DRIVE TUESDAY

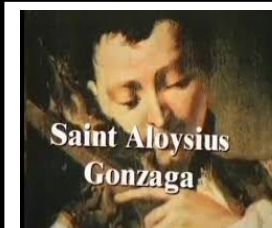

SAINT ALOYSIUS GONZAGA Feast Day June 21

Did you know that St. Aloysius isn't really the patron saint of bulldogs? He probably didn't play basketball either -- and just how do you pronounce ALOYSIUS?... So just what did he do then to become a saint? Well, while quite young he formed the resolution of becoming a Jesuit. After much difficulty in securing his father's consent, and renouncing his aristocratic heritage he succeeded. As a student he early showed himself to be brilliant in philosophy, theology, and other studies. In 1591 a famine and pestilence broke out in Italy. Though in delicate health, he devoted himself to the care of the sick. He privately confessed to his spiritual director that his constitution was revolted by the sights and smells of the work and that he had to work hard to overcome his physical repulsion yet he persevered. He soon succumbed to the plague and died on June 21, 1591. At canonization he was declared patron saint of young students such as himself and later patron of all Christian youth. Additionally, owing to the manner of his death, and for his compassion and courage in the face of an incurable disease, Aloysius Gonzaga has become the patron both of AIDS sufferers and their caregivers.
